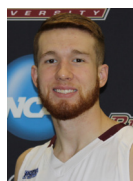

STARTING FIVE

- The Huskies open league play with a pair of crossover games at Pitt-Johnstown and IUP this weekend. Bloomsburg was just 1-5 against teams from the PSAC West last season with the only win coming against Edinboro (97-84) on January 9.

- Bloomsburg lost to both Pitt-Johnstown and IUP last season at the Nelson Field House. The Mountain Cats defeated the Huskies, 71-70, while the Crimson Hawks posted a 63-61 win over Bloomsburg the following day. Both losses came on game-winning shots within the final ten seconds of regulation.

- Redshirt senior Christian Mortellite needs three three-pointers to break the school's all-time record for most career three-pointers. Mortellite enters the weekend with 235 career makes - Lorenzo Christmas holds the record with 237 from 2010-14.

- Mortellite has moved into third on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,535 career points. He trails only the school's all-time leading scorer, Mike Ellzy (1,911) and Jerry Radocha (1,778). Mortellite set the Bloomsburg single-season school-record last season with 614 points.

- With eight blocks in the first two games of the season, senior Kyle-Michael Rose has moved into ninth place on the school's all-time list with 77 career blocked shots. Adam Bohman (1999-03) is eighth with 90.

THE COACHES ...

John Sanow is in his 12th season as head coach of the Huskies and sports an overall record of 135-163. Over the last six seasons, Sanow has guided the Huskies to a PSAC Tournament berth five times and a share of the PSAC Eastern Division regular season championship in 2011-12. He was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year that season. During the stretch, Bloomsburg has gone 85-78.

Bob Rukavina is in his 29th season as the head coach at Pitt-Johnstown. He has guided the Mountain Cats to a 454-320 overall record. He earned his 450th win at Pitt-Johnstown with an 88-67 victory at California University (PA) on February 15, 2017 and has led the team to four NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and seven 20-win seasons.

Joe Lombardi is in his 12th year at IUP and sports an overall record of 251-91. Under his tutelage, the Crimson Hawks have made eight NCAA tournament appearances, won three PSAC tournament titles, won two Atlantic Region Championships, and made two Division II National Championship Game appearances. He became the program all-time winningest coach with a 72-64 win over the University of the Sciences on November 27, 2015.

THE SERIES ...

Pitt-Johnstown leads the all-time series against Bloomsburg, 21-13. IUP, meanwhile, holds a slim, 30-26, edge over the Huskies in their series history.

LAST TIME OUT ...

Bloomsburg outscored Georgian Court, 29-6, over the final ten minutes to erase a 12-point deficit and escape with a 70-59 victory in Lakewood, New Jersey on Wednesday night. The Huskies went 12-of-12 from the foul line over the last five minutes and finished 16-of-17 from the charity stripe in the second half. Christian Mortellite posted his second double-double in as many games as he poured in a game-high 25 points while also grabbing a game-high ten rebounds. Kyle-Michael Rose and Austin Harriott each chipped in 14 points. Harriott grabbed seven rebounds while Rose added five boards and four blocks.

Pitt-Johnstown is coming off of an 80-69 win over Urbana at the IUP Tip-Off Tournament last Saturday. The Mountain Cats lost their opener, 79-75, against Virginia State. Against Urbana, the Mountain Cats led from wire-to-wire and committed just four turnovers. Isaac Vescovi scored 33 points on 14-of-21 shooting to lead the Mountain Cats in scoring. Josh Wise added 23 points while Marcin Wiszomirski chipped in 12 points off the bench.

IUP, meanwhile, suffered a 69-64 loss to Virginia State in the final game of its tip-off tournament last Saturday night. After trailing by five at halftime, the Crimson Hawks took a four-point lead with 7:43 left in regulation but could not hang on. Anthony Glover paced IUP with 21 points while Jacobo Diaz added 15 points and 12 rebounds. Blake Danielak chipped in 14 points as the trio combined for 50 of the team's 64 points.

SCOUTING BLOOMSBURG ...

The Huskies enter the contest with a 2-0 overall record on the season after posting wins over Penn State Hazleton (94-55) on November 10 and Georgian Court (70-59) on November 15. Bloomsburg is averaging 82.0 points per game while allowing just 57.0 points per game defensively. The Huskies have made 22 three-pointers through the first two games and are shooting 38.6% from deep. The Huskies have dominated the glass as they are +14.0 in rebounding margin to date. Opponents, meanwhile, are shooting just 35.9% from the field and 28.2% from long range.

Redshirt senior Christian Mortellite has posted double-doubles in each of the first two games and he leads the way by averaging 25.5 points and 10.0 rebounds on the young season. He has hit eight triples and needs only three to become the school's all-time leader in career three-pointers. Mortellite enters the weekend with 235 career triples. Sophomore Austin Harriott is second on the team in scoring, averaging 14.5 points. The Division I transfer from Loyola (Md.) has appeared off the bench in each of the first two games. He has contributed 10 rebounds, four assists, and three blocks in his first two games in a Huskies' uniform. Senior Kyle-Michael Rose is averaging 12.0 points per game and leads both the PSAC and the country in blocked shots per game (4.0) early on. Another Division I transfer, sophomore Khary Mauras, has chipped in 10.0 points per game to date. The transfer from Old Dominion also averages 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists and leads the Huskies in assists per game. Keep an eye on redshirt freshman Peyton Mortellite (7.5 ppg) and freshman Matthew Kachelries (6.5 ppg) who, along with Harriott, provide the Huskies with depth off the bench.

SCOUTING PITT-JOHNSTOWN ...

The Mountain Cats are 1-1 to start the season after splitting a pair of games at the IUP Tip-Off Tournament last weekend. Pitt-Johnstown lost to Virginia State, 79-75, to open the season and then posted an 80-69 win over Urbana. The Mountain Cats average 77.5 points on offense and allow opponents to score 74.0 points per game. Pitt-Johnstown is -9.5 in rebounding margin but have made up for it by committing only 12 total turnovers in the first two games of the season.

Isaac Vescovi paces the Mountain Cats in scoring as he averages 25.5 points per game. He is coming off of a 33-point night against Urbana last Saturday. Vescovi is shooting 67.9% from the field (19-of-28) and has knocked down 6-of-8 from beyond the arc. Josh Wise averages 14.5 points per game while Dale Clancy (11.0 ppg) and Drew Magestro (10.5 ppg) are also in double figures early. Marcin Wiszomirski leads the Mountain Cats in rebounding (5.0) while Clancy paces the team in assists (7.0).

SCOUTING IUP ...

IUP, picked to win the PSAC West, is off to a 1-3 start in 2017-18. The Crimson Hawks opened the season with an 80-61 loss to #20 Findlay and then an 86-82 setback to #10 Ferris State at the SCB Hall of Fame Classic in Evansville, Indiana on November 3 and 4. Last weekend, IUP posted a 93-60 win over Urbana before dropping a 69-64 decision to Virginia State in its own tip-off tournament. IUP averages 75.0 points per game and allows 73.8 points per game on defense. The Crimson Hawks are +3.0 in rebounding margin and are shooting 47.1% from the field through the first four games of the season. IUP is scheduled to play Lock Haven on Saturday before its matchup with the Huskies on Sunday afternoon.

Anthony Glover leads the Crimson Hawks in scoring, averaging 18.0 points per game. He is 15-of-19 (78.9%) from the foul line and leads the squad in steals with seven. Blake Danielak is second, averaging 12.5 points per contest, while Dante Lombardi chips in 12.3 points per game. Lombardi leads the team with 19 assists. Jacobo Diaz is also in double figures, averaging 10.3 points and a team-high 10.5 rebounds. Diaz has two double-doubles to his credit this season.

MORE ON MORTELLITE ...

Redshirt junior Christian Mortellite continues his rapid ascent up Bloomsburg's all-time scoring list. The sharpshooter currently sits in third place on the school's all-time list with 1,535 career points. Mortellite has 44 career 20-point efforts in 81 collegiate games. He has hit double figures in 64 of his last 67 games and has been held to under 10 points in a game only ten times in his career. Mortellite needs 244 points to pass Jerry Radocha (1973-77) for second and needs 377 points to become the school's all-time leader. Mike Ellzy (1993-97) currently holds the record with 1,911 career points.

DOWNTOWN WITH THE HUSKIES ...

The Huskies have made at least one three-pointer in 183 consecutive games. The last time Bloomsburg did not make a three in a game was on December 4, 2010 in a 54-51 loss at Lock Haven when it went 0-7 from beyond the arc. Bloomsburg made at least ten three-pointers in a game eight times last season after achieving that feat just one time last in 2015-16. Bloomsburg started strong in that department this season, knocking down 16-of-37 from beyond the arc (43.2%) against Penn State Hazleton on November 10. The Huskies, however, made only six on Wednesday against Georgian Court. Christian Mortellite led the country in threes-per-game (4.07) last season. In fact, Mortellite's 4.07 three-pointers made per game were third in the entire country (Division I, II, and III). He trailed only Division III's Julian Marx of Grinnell (4.78) and Division III's Marcus Echevarria of Nichols (4.57) in the category. The leader at the Division I level was Central Michigan's Marcus Keene at 3.91. He needs three triples to become the school's all-time leader in three-pointers made. He enters the weekend with 235 - Lorenzo Christmas (2010-14) holds the record with 237.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK ...

At Georgian Court on Wednesday night, the Huskies trailed 53-41 with 10:08 left in regulation before outscoring the Lions, 29-6, over the final ten minutes to earn the 70-59 victory. Bloomsburg went 12-of-12 from the free throw line in the final five minutes and finished the second half, 16-of-17, from the charity stripe. Austin Harriott's layup with 4:40 left gave the Huskies a lead they would not relinquish as they held the Lions to just one point over the final six minutes of regulation. During the run, Christian Mortellite scored 10 points while sophomore Khary Mauras and Austin Harriott added eight and six, respectively.

COMING UP ROSES ...

Senior Kyle-Michael Rose leads the PSAC and the country in blocks per game (4.0) on the young season. With his eight blocks, Rose has moved into ninth on the school's all-time list with 77 career blocks. He is 23 blocks away from becoming the seventh player in school history to record 100 career blocks. Larry Webster holds the career record with 175.

HOT START ...

The Huskies had six players finish in double figures during the season-opening, 94-55, victory over Penn State Hazleton. Christian Mortellite (26), Austin Harriott (15), Peyton Mortellite (12), Khary Mauras (12), Kyle-Michael Rose (10), and Matthew Kachelries (10) all reached double digits in the victory. Harriott and Mauras were playing in their first game as a Husky after transferring in from Division I Loyola (Md.) and Old Dominion, respectively, while Peyton Mortellite and Kachelries were playing in their first collegiate games.

YOUTH MOVEMENT ...

The Huskies have just three seniors and no juniors on this year's roster and returned only three players from last year's team that finished 15-12. One of the three seniors - Hashim Moore - transferred in from Division I Princeton and is in his first season with the Huskies. Christian Mortellite and Kyle-Michael Rose are the other two seniors on the team while redshirt sophomore Sam Saxton joins the duo as the only returning player from last year's team. Redshirt freshman Peyton Mortellite was on last year's roster but did not play.

UP NEXT ...

The Huskies will return home on Tuesday, November 21, to host Holy Family University at the Nelson Field House. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. Bloomsburg and Holy Family have met only once in the all-time series with the Tigers posting an 80-68 victory over the Huskies early in the 2005-06 season.

BLOOMSBURG PICKED SEVENTH IN PSAC EAST

Coming off of a 15-12 season, Bloomsburg was picked to finish seventh in the PSAC Eastern Division according to the preseason poll that was released in late October.

HEAD COACH JOHN SANOW

John Sanow begins his 12th season as head coach of the men's basketball program at Bloomsburg in 2017-18. In his first 11 seasons with the Huskies, he has guided the program to a record of 133-163 and is second all-time in career wins in school history.

Over the last six seasons, the Huskies have made the PSAC tournament five times and earned a share of the PSAC Eastern Division regular season championship in 2011-12. Bloomsburg has gone 85-78 during the stretch.

Last year, the Huskies made the playoffs for the second year in a row only to bow out after an 84-77 setback to West Chester, at home, in the opening round of the tournament.

The highlight of the 2016-17 campaign was the play of Christian Mortellite. The sharpshooter was named to the All-PSAC Eastern Division First Team for the second year in a row after leading the country in three-pointers made per game (4.07). He was also honored as an NABC Second Team All-District - the first Husky to be recognized by the NABC since Dontahe Jordan in 2011-12. He led the Huskies in scoring (22.7), becoming the first Huskies' player since Tom Barlow, who averaged 20.3 points per game during the 2002-03 season, to average at least 20 points per game in a single campaign. Mortellite broke the single-season school record for points with 613 last year which broke the previous record of 600 set by Mike Elly during the 1996-97 season. He also shattered the school-record for most threes made in a season (110) and three-point attempts in a season (255).

In 2015-16, the Huskies returned to the PSAC playoffs after a one-year hiatus. Bloomsburg finished 17-10 overall and won 10 of its last 12 regular season games before suffering an 80-78 loss at Shippensburg in the opening round of the conference playoffs. The 17 victories marked the second-highest single-season total under Sanow's tutelage while the team's 15-7 mark in the PSAC East tied for the best conference mark with Sanow at the helm. Mortellite was an All-PSAC East First Team honoree.

Sanow helped guide the Huskies to three straight PSAC postseason appearances from 2012 to 2014 - the longest streak for the school since an eight-year run from 1995 to 2002. The Huskies earned the third seed from the Eastern Division in the 2013-14 PSAC playoffs and picked up a first round victory over Kutztown, ultimately finishing the season at 16-12 overall and 10-6 in conference play. It was Bloomsburg's first postseason win since the 2002 playoffs. Following the season, Dontahe Jordan was named First Team All-PSAC East while fellow senior Lorenzo Christmas earned a spot on the Second Team. Both players finished their careers with more than 1,000 points with Christmas owning the school's all-time record for made three-pointers and Jordan became one of only five players in BU history to reach both 1,000 points and 700 rebounds. He also coached Alssene Saintilus, who signed a contract to play professionally in Italy following the 2014-15 season.

Overall, Sanow has more than 25 years of experience with previous coaching stops at the University of Vermont along with Division II schools Gannon University and Pitt-Johnstown. He also spent 11 years as an assistant coach at Division I St. Francis of Pennsylvania.

Sanow was named PSAC East Coach of the Year in 2011-12 after leading the Huskies to 19 victories. That season, Sanow produced one of the best men's basketball seasons at Bloomsburg in recent memory. He led the Huskies to a 19-9 record, their best showing in

11 years, and a share of the PSAC Eastern crown. The Huskies also made a trip to the PSAC playoffs for the first time in 10 seasons and hosted their first home play-off game since the 1998-99 season. Sanow coached the PSAC Eastern Player of the Year in Dontahe Jordan, who also earned NABC All-District First Team honors and Daktronics Atlantic Region Second Team honors, as well as the PSAC Eastern Defensive Athlete of the Year in Larry Webster, who would later go on to play in the NFL with the Detroit Lions.

Sanow's players also reached career milestones in the 2011-12 season. Both Trevon Johnson and Webster scored their 1,000th career points under Sanow's tutelage. They were the first Bloomsburg players to reach the 1,000 point plateau in five years. In addition, Webster cemented his place among Bloomsburg greats by ending his career as Bloomsburg's all-time shot blocker with 175 career rejections.

In 2010-11, the Huskies narrowly missed out on reaching the PSAC playoffs losing out on the final game of the year. The Huskies seven PSAC Eastern Division wins were the most for the team since the 2000-01 season. Sanow also coached the PSAC Eastern Division Rookie of the Year in Dontahe Jordan. During the season Jordan was named the PSAC East Rookie of the Week seven times.

In 2009-10, the Huskies just missed out on the PSAC playoffs after dropping its final game of the season. Among the 12 wins for the Huskies was a 12-point victory over seventh-ranked Kutztown. Bloomsburg also lost several close games suffering four defeats in overtime.

In his first season with the Huskies in 2006-07, Sanow guided the Huskies to a mark of 13-14, an improvement of seven wins from the previous season and the first time since 2001-02 that the team reached double figures in wins. Sanow won his first six games as coach and had the team nationally ranked for the first time in several years. He also closed out the season winning four of the final five games and just missed out on a berth in the PSAC playoffs. Also, the eight wins the Huskies recorded at the Nelson Field House were the most since the team won 10 in 2000-01.

A native of Windber, Pa., who is well connected in basketball in the East, Sanow is a 1987 graduate of Indiana (Pa.) University. After transferring from Clarion University in 1984, he led IUP in scoring and was an All-PSAC First Team selection in 1986. He also set numerous three-point shooting records for the Indians.

At Vermont in 2005-06, he was part of a new coaching staff that led the least-experienced team in the nation in D-I (no seniors, two juniors, five sophomores and seven freshmen) to the America East Championship game for the fourth straight season. The sixth-seeded Catamounts (13-17, 7-9 America East) topped #3 Boston University and #2 Binghamton before falling at top-seeded Albany in the title game.

While at St. Francis (Pa.), he was an integral part of the Red Flash winning the 1991 Northeast Conference title and a trip to the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. In 1992, he also was an assistant coach for the Panama Men's Olympic Team in its attempt to qualify for the Summer Olympics in Barcelona. While at St. Francis, he coached Mike Iuzzolino, who went on to play for the NBA's Dallas Mavericks.
