STARTING FIVE

- Bloomsburg steps out of conference action on Tuesday night to host Holy Family at the Nelson Field House. The two teams have met only once previously with Holy Family earning an 80-68 win over the Huskies on November 19, 2005.

- Both teams will be looking to snap modest losing streaks on Tuesday night. The Huskies will try to bounce back from an 0-2 weekend against PSAC Western Division rivals, Pitt-Johnstown and IUP, while the Tigers will be searching for their first win of the season in their fourth game.

- With 5:49 left in the first half during Sunday's overtime loss at IUP, redshirt senior Christian Mortellite became the school's all-time leader in career three-pointers made with his 238th career make, surpassing Lorenzo Christmas' previous record of 237 from 2010-14. He added two more later to give him 240 for his career. The all-time Bloomsburg record (men or women) is held by Dana Wieller who hit 332 during her career from 2009-13.

- Mortellite has moved into third on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,570 career points. He trails only the school's all-time leading scorer, Mike Ellzy (1,911) and Jerry Radocha (1,778). Mortellite set the Bloomsburg single-season school-record last season with 614 points.

- With 12 blocks through the first four games of the season, senior Kyle-Michael Rose has moved into ninth place on the school's all-time list with 81 career blocked shots. Adam Bohman (1999-03) is eighth with 90.

THE COACHES ...

John Sanow is in his 12th season as head coach of the Huskies and sports an overall record of 135-165. Over the last six seasons, Sanow has guided the Huskies to a PSAC Tournament berth five times and a share of the PSAC Eastern Division regular season championship in 2011-12. He was named the PSAC East Coach of the Year that season. Over the last six years, entering this season, Bloomsburg has gone 85-78.

R.C. Kehoe is in his seventh season at Holy Family and has guided the Tigers to a 110-68 overall record. Last season, Holy Family went 11-17 - Kehoe's first losing season since his first year when he went 12-14. In the previous two seasons, Kehoe and the Tigers went 48-14. In 2015-16, Holy Family went 26-6 and set a new school-record for most wins in a season since joining Division II in 2003-04. That season, the Tigers claimed their first-ever CACC Tournament championship.

THE SERIES ...

Holy Family leads the all-time series, 1-0, after posting an 80-68 win over the Huskies in the only prior meeting between the two schools back on November 19, 2005.

LAST TIME OUT ...

Bloomsburg dropped its second consecutive game, this time in heartbreaking fashion, 83-81 in overtime at IUP on Sunday afternoon. The game featured 14 ties and 21 lead changes including eight of each over the last four minutes of regulation and the five minutes in overtime. IUP's Jacobo Diaz got a tip-in to fall at the buzzer in overtime to give the Crimson Hawks the victory. Redshirt senior Christian Mortellite scored 26 points while adding six rebounds, three assists, and a career-high four steals. Four other Huskies joined Mortellite in double figures. Senior Kyle-Michael Rose finished with 16 points on 6-of-6 from the field and 4-of-5 from the foul line. Sophomore Khary Mauras finished with 13. Graduate student Hashim Moore added a season-high 11 points before fouling out while redshirt sophomore Sam Saxton chipped in with 10 points and a team-high four assists.

Holy Family is coming off of an 82-65 loss against Shepherd University on Wednesday, November 15. Shepherd led 35-29 at the break and then pulled away with a 13-2 run at the outset of the second half. The Rams led by as many as 19 later in the half. Jerrel Burke and Maliq Sanders led the way with 19 points apiece. Terrell Jones had 11 points and a team-high nine rebounds while Mekhi Bryant chipped in with nine points and a team-best five assists.

SCOUTING BLOOMSBURG ...

Bloomsburg enters the contest with a 2-2 overall record but will be looking to get back on track after a pair of weekend losses at Pitt-Johnstown (92-65) on Saturday and IUP (83-81 (OT)) on Sunday. The Huskies are averaging 77.5 points per game on offense and rank fourth in the PSAC in scoring defense by allowing 72.3 points per game. Bloomsburg is +4.3 in rebounding margin - seventh in the PSAC - but is -0.7 in turnover margin - 14th in the conference.

Redshirt senior **Christian Mortellite** leads the Huskies, and is tied for seventh in the PSAC, in scoring by averaging 21.5 points per game. He has scored at least 25 points in three of the first four games but was held to just nine points in the loss at Pitt-Johnstown on Saturday. On Sunday, Mortellite became the school's all-time leader in career three-pointers made as he has 240 for his career. He did have an uncharacteristically-rough weekend shooting as he made only 12-of-34 (35.3%) from the field and 5-of-19 (26.3%) from beyond the arc. Mortellite also leads the team in rebounding (7.3), assists (14), and steals (8) through four games this season. Sophomore **Khary Mauras** is second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.3 points per game. Mauras had a season-high 20 points in the loss at Pitt-Johnstown on Saturday. Senior **Kyle-Michael Rose** averages 12.3 points per game and leads the team with 12 blocked shots. He is ninth on the school's all-time list with 81 career swats. Sophomore **Austin Harriott** is also in double figures as he posts 10.0 points per game despite coming off the bench in all four contests. Redshirt sophomore **Sam Saxton** had back-to-back double-digit scoring efforts over the weekend and is averaging 7.7 points per game.

SCOUTING HOLY FAMILY ...

Holy Family is 0-3 on the young season having lost all three game at home - American International (71-67) on November 11, Merrimack (85-69) on November 12, and Shepherd (82-65) on November 15. The Tigers have struggled shooting the basketball which has led to an average of just 67.0 points per game on offense. Meanwhile, Holy Family allows opponents to score at a 79.3 per-game clip. The Tigers are shooting just 33.2% from the field and 28.0% from beyond the arc. Holy Family is -2.0 in rebounding margin but has committed only 36 turnovers through three contests.

Maliq Sanders has shared the team lead in scoring in each of the first three games and he leads the Tigers by averaging 15.7 points per game. He is second on the team in rebounding (5.7). **Jerrel Burke** is second on the team, averaging 13.0 points per game. However, he is shooting just 12-of-47 (25.5%) from the field. **Mekhi Bryant** (10.7) and **Terrell Jones** (10.0) are also in double figures through the first three games. **Jalen Thompson** leads the team in rebounding, pulling down 9.7 boards per contest. He averages 8.7 points per game.

ANOTHER RECORD ...

Redshirt senior Christian Mortellite became the school's all-time leader in career three-pointers on Sunday afternoon as he broke Lorenzo Christmas' previous record of 237 from 2010-14. Mortellite now holds the school record for most career triples (240), most single-season triples (110), and most points in a single season (613). He needs 342 points to become the school's all-time leading scorer.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ...

Through only four games this season, the Huskies have had eight different players reach double figures in scoring at least once. Khary Mauras, Christian Mortellite, and Kyle-Michael Rose have reached double-digits three times while Sam Saxton and Austin Harriott have done it twice. Hasim Moore, Matthew Kachelries, and Peyton Mortellite have reached double digits once. Those eight players are all averaging at least 4.0 points per game this season.

NOT FOUL AT THE LINE ...

Bloomsburg is shooting 77.2% from the free throw line this season and have outscored its opponents from the stripe in each of the first four games. The Huskies are +22 from the foul line this season (61-39). Christian Mortellite (15-of-15) and Khary Mauras (12-of-12) have yet to miss from the line while Kyle-Michael Rose has made 12-of-14 (85.7%). Austin Harriott has been to the line the most through the first four games - 17-of-22 (77.3%). All told, the Huskies are 61-of-79 from the line but Hashim Moore has gone just 4-of-13 from the stripe. If Moore's numbers are taken out, the other 11 players have combined to go 57-of-66 (86.4%).

MORE ON MORTELLITE ...

Redshirt junior Christian Mortellite continues his rapid ascent up Bloomsburg's all-time scoring list. The sharpshooter currently sits in third place on the school's all-time list with 1,570 career points. Mortellite has 45 career 20-point efforts in 83 collegiate games. He has hit double figures in 65 of his last 69 games and has been held to under 10 points in a game only 11 times in his career. Mortellite needs 209 points to pass Jerry Radocha (1973-77) for second and needs 342 points to become the school's all-time leader. Mike Ellzy (1993-97) currently holds the record with 1,911 career points.

DOWNTOWN WITH THE HUSKIES ...

The Huskies have made at least one three-pointer in 185 consecutive games. The last time Bloomsburg did not make a three in a game was on December 4, 2010 in a 54-51 loss at Lock Haven when it went 0-7 from beyond the arc. Bloomsburg made at least ten three-pointers in a game eight times last season after achieving that feat just one time last in 2015-16. Bloomsburg has reached double digits once this season but have made at least six in all four games. Christian Mortellite led the country in threes-per-game (4.07) last season. In fact, Mortellite's 4.07 three-pointers made per game were third in the entire country (Division I, II, and III). He trailed only Division III's Julian Marx of Grinnell (4.78) and Division III's Marcus Echevarria of Nichols (4.57) in the category. The leader at the Division I level was Central Michigan's Marcus Keene at 3.91.

IT'S ROUGH OUT WEST ...

Bloomsburg went 0-2 this past weekend at Pitt-Johnstown (92-65) on Saturday and at IUP (83-81 (OT)) on Sunday. Since the 2012-13 season, the Huskies are just 8-25 against opponents from the PSAC Western Division and just 2-16 in games played on the road against such opponents. Bloomsburg went 4-2 against PSAC West foes during the 2015-16 season - 2-1 on the road.

COMING UP ROSES ...

With his 12 blocks through the first four games of the season, senior Kyle-Michael Rose has moved into ninth on the school's all-time list with 81 career blocks. He is 19 blocks away from becoming the seventh player in school history to record 100 career blocks. Larry Webster holds the career record with 175.

HOT START ...

The Huskies had six players finish in double figures during the season-opening, 94-55, victory over Penn State Hazleton. Christian Mortellite (26), Austin Harriott (15), Peyton Mortellite (12), Khary Maura (12), Kyle-Michael Rose (10), and Matthew Kachelries (10) all reached double digits in the victory. Harriott and Maura were playing in their first game as a Husky after transferring in from Division I Loyola (Md.) and Old Dominion, respectively, while Peyton Mortellite and Kachelries were playing in their first collegiate games.

In the loss at IUP on Sunday, Bloomsburg had five players in double figures - Christian Mortellite (26), Rose (16), Maura (13), Hashim Moore (11), and Sam Saxton (10).

YOUTH MOVEMENT ...

The Huskies have just three seniors and no juniors on this year's roster and returned only three players from last year's team that finished 15-12. One of the three seniors - Hashim Moore - transferred in from Division I Princeton and is in his first season with the Huskies. Christian Mortellite and Kyle-Michael Rose are the other two seniors on the team while redshirt sophomore Sam Saxton joins the duo as the only returning player from last year's team. Redshirt freshman Peyton Mortellite was on last year's roster but did not play.

UP NEXT ...

Bloomsburg will be back in action on Wednesday, November 29, when it heads to Rutherford, New Jersey for a contest at Felician College. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. Following that game, the Huskies will play three consecutive home games against PSAC West rivals California (December 2), Slippery Rock (December 3), and Clarion (December 9) before taking off for the holiday break.

BLOOMSBURG PICKED SEVENTH IN PSAC EAST

Coming off of a 15-12 season, Bloomsburg was picked to finish seventh in the PSAC Eastern Division according to the preseason poll that was released in late October.

John Sanow begins his 12th season as head coach of the men's basketball program at Bloomsburg in 2017-18. In his first 11 seasons with the Huskies, he has guided the program to a record of 133-163 and is second all-time in career wins in school history.

Over the last six seasons, the Huskies have made the PSAC tournament five times and earned a share of the PSAC Eastern Division regular season championship in 2011-12. Bloomsburg has gone 85-78 during the stretch.

Last year, the Huskies made the playoffs for the second year in a row only to bow out after an 84-77 setback to West Chester, at home, in the opening round of the tournament.

The highlight of the 2016-17 campaign was the play of Christian Mortellite. The sharpshooter was named to the All-PSAC Eastern Division First Team for the second year in a row after leading the country in three-pointers made per game (4.07). He was also honored as an NABC Second Team All-District - the first Husky to be recognized by the NABC since Dontahe Jordan in 2011-12. He led the Huskies in scoring (22.7), becoming the first Huskies' player since Tom Barlow, who averaged 20.3 points per game during the 2002-03 season, to average at least 20 points per game in a single campaign. Mortellite broke the single-season school record for points with 613 last year which broke the previous record of 600 set by Mike Ellzy during the 1996-97 season. He also shattered the school-record for most threes made in a season (110) and three-point attempts in a season (255).

In 2015-16, the Huskies returned to the PSAC playoffs after a one-year hiatus. Bloomsburg finished 17-10 overall and won 10 of its last 12 regular season games before suffering an 80-78 loss at Shippensburg in the opening round of the conference playoffs. The 17 victories marked the second-highest single-season total under Sanow's tutelage while the team's 15-7 mark in the PSAC East tied for the best conference mark with Sanow at the helm. Mortellite was an All-PSAC East First Team honoree.

Sanow helped guide the Huskies to three straight PSAC postseason appearances from 2012 to 2014 - the longest streak for the school since an eight-year run from 1995 to 2002. The Huskies earned the third seed from the Eastern Division in the 2013-14 PSAC playoffs and picked up a first round victory over Kutztown, ultimately finishing the season at 16-12 overall and 10-6 in conference play. It was Bloomsburg's first postseason win since the 2002 playoffs. Following the season, Dontahe Jordan was named First Team All-PSAC East while fellow senior Lorenzo Christmas earned a spot on the Second Team. Both players finished their careers with more than 1,000 points with Christmas owning the school's all-time record for made three-pointers and Jordan became one of only five players in BU history to reach both 1,000 points and 700 rebounds. He also coached Alssene Sainilus, who signed a contract to play professionally in Italy following the 2014-15 season.

Overall, Sanow has more than 25 years of experience with previous coaching stops at the University of Vermont along with Division II schools Gannon University and Pitt-Johnstown. He also spent 11 years as an assistant coach at Division I St. Francis of Pennsylvania.

Sanow was named PSAC East Coach of the Year in 2011-12 after leading the Huskies to 19 victories. That season, Sanow produced one of the best men's basketball seasons at Bloomsburg in recent memory. He led the Huskies to a 19-9 record, their best showing in

11 years, and a share of the PSAC Eastern crown. The Huskies also made a trip to the PSAC playoffs for the first time in 10 seasons and hosted their first home playoff game since the 1998-99 season. Sanow coached the PSAC Eastern Player of the Year in Dontahe Jordan, who also earned NABC All-District First Team honors and Daktronics Atlantic Region Second Team honors, as well as the PSAC Eastern Defensive Athlete of the Year in Larry Webster, who would later go on to play in the NFL with the Detroit Lions.

Sanow's players also reached career milestones in the 2011-12 season. Both Trevon Johnson and Webster scored their 1,000th career points under Sanow's tutelage. They were the first Bloomsburg players to reach the 1,000 point plateau in five years. In addition, Webster cemented his place among Bloomsburg greats by ending his career as Bloomsburg's all-time shot blocker with 175 career rejections.

In 2010-11, the Huskies narrowly missed out on reaching the PSAC playoffs losing out on the final game of the year. The Huskies seven PSAC Eastern Division wins were the most for the team since the 2000-01 season. Sanow also coached the PSAC Eastern Division Rookie of the Year in Dontahe Jordan. During the season Jordan was named the PSAC East Rookie of the Week seven times.

In 2009-10, the Huskies just missed out on the PSAC playoffs after dropping its final game of the season. Among the 12 wins for the Huskies was a 12-point victory over seventh-ranked Kutztown. Bloomsburg also lost several close games suffering four defeats in overtime.

In his first season with the Huskies in 2006-07, Sanow guided the Huskies to a mark of 13-14, an improvement of seven wins from the previous season and the first time since 2001-02 that the team reached double figures in wins. Sanow won his first six games as coach and had the team nationally ranked for the first time in several years. He also closed out the season winning four of the final five games and just missed out on a berth in the PSAC playoffs. Also, the eight wins the Huskies recorded at the Nelson Field House were the most since the team won 10 in 2000-01.

A native of Windber, Pa., who is well connected in basketball in the East, Sanow is a 1987 graduate of Indiana (Pa.) University. After transferring from Clarion University in 1984, he led IUP in scoring and was an All-PSAC First Team selection in 1986. He also set numerous three-point shooting records for the Indians.

At Vermont in 2005-06, he was part of a new coaching staff that led the least-experienced team in the nation in D-I (no seniors, two juniors, five sophomores and seven freshmen) to the America East Championship game for the fourth straight season. The sixth-seeded Catamounts (13-17, 7-9 America East) topped #3 Boston University and #2 Binghamton before falling at top-seeded Albany in the title game.

While at St. Francis (Pa.), he was an integral part of the Red Flash winning the 1991 Northeast Conference title and a trip to the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. In 1992, he also was an assistant coach for the Panama Men's Olympic Team in its attempt to qualify for the Summer Olympics in Barcelona. While at St. Francis, he coached Mike Iuzzolino, who went on to play for the NBA's Dallas Mavericks.
