BLOOMSBURG FIELD HOCKEY - THROUGH THE YEARS

1974

Bloomsburg plays the first field hockey game in school history and wins 3-1 over Bucknell. Mary Gardner is the coach.

1975

The Huskies post a record of 4-5-2. It is the last time a Bloomsburg field hockey team did not have a winning record.

1976

The Huskies post two 10-0 shutouts during the year on their way to a record of 7-2-2.

1977

The team ties a school record with 11 goals in an 11-2 win over Marywood College. The Huskies post their third winning season in four years.

1978

Jan Hutchinson hired as head coach. The Huskies go 10-3-1 in her first year, posting seven shutouts during the season.

1979

Bloomsburg goes 4-4-4 in Hutchinson's second year. The team ends the season with two wins and two ties.

1980

The first Pennsylvania Conference championship tournament is held with the Huskies finishing third.

1981

The Huskies win their first-ever wom-

en's national championship with a 3-2 win over Lynchburg in the finals of the AIAW Division III tournament. During the season, the Huskies win the 50th game in the program's history, a 4-1 win over Mansfield.

1982

The Huskies finish second in the newly-created NCAA field hockey championship. In the opening round of the Division II tournament, the Huskies beat Chico (CA) State, 1-0.

1983

Bloomsburg wins the NCAA Division II championship with a 1-0 win over Lock Haven. Laurie Snyder and Deb Long cap careers by earning All-American status for the third straight year.

1984

The Huskies complete a perfect 19-0-0 season by winning the NCAA Division III championship with a 3-2 win over Messiah. Among the 19 wins was the 100th in team history, a 3-0 win over Kean College. Karen Hertzler, Lynn Hurst and Diane Shields earn All-American honors.

1985

A 4-3 loss to Shippensburg ends the Huskies winning streak at 39 games. Bloomsburg finishes third in the NCAA Division III championships. Karen Hertzler ends career as national Player of the Year and a two-time All-American. Donna Graupp and Carla Shearer named All-Americans.

The 1987 Huskies squad set a then-school record with 24 wins on their way to an NCAA championship, the fourth in BU's history.

1986

It was second place in both the Pennsylvania Conference and the NCAA Division III championships. Hurst, Shearer and Graupp named All-Americans.

1987

The Huskies win their fourth national championship with a 1-0 victory over William Smith. The 24 wins represent a new school record. Cindy Daeche and Sharon Reilly named All-Americans.

1988

A 1-0 win over Kutztown gives Bloomsburg the PSAC championship. At the Division III championships, the Huskies finish second, losing a two-overtime thriller to Trenton State. Daneen Fero named the National Player of the Year, while Alicia Terrizzi named All-American. Set school single-game record for goals with 13 against Marywood.

1989

For the second year in a row, the Huskies lost the NCAA Division III championship game in overtime after St. Lawrence beat the Huskies, 2-1. Sharon Reilly and Kathy Frick named All-Americans.

1990

The Huskies rolled through the first 23 games of the year without a loss. But, in the season's final game, the NCAA championship, Trenton State dashed the hopes of a Huskies' title with a 2-1 win.

Gisela Smith named National Player of the Year, while Frick and Trudy Horst earn All-American honors.

1991

Heartbreak again for the Huskies in

the NCAA title game with a 1-0 loss to Trenton State. Smith repeats as Player of the Year with Horst, Beth Bowman and Denise Miller being named All-Americans.

1992

The Huskies won the PSAC title with a 2-1 win over Lock Haven, but lost a week later to the Bald Eagles in the NCAA finals. Denise Miller wins the Player of the Year award for the third straight year. Shelley Miller and Lori Hippensteel named All-Americans.

1993

For the first time since 1987, the Huskies win the national championship. Bloomsburg sweeps Lock Haven for both the PSAC and NCAA titles. Shelley Miller named Player of the Year, while Nicole Schiavello, Michelle

McFalls and Chris Basalyga named All-Americans.

1994

The Huskies go 16-1-2 in the regular season but drop a pair of 2-1 games to Lock Haven in the PSAC and NCAA

title games. Shelley Miller, Basalyga, Chris Fink and Rachel Trinidad named All-Americans.

1995

For the second straight year, the Huskies finish runners-up in both the PSAC and NCAA championships. TBloomsburg tied a school record with 16 shut-outs during the season. Four players, Basalyga, Michelle Martin, Tracy Bandt and Nicole Mower are named All-Americans.

1996

Player of the Year Michelle Martin leads the Huskies back to the top with a 2-1 win over Lock Haven in the NCAA finals. Martin sets a school record with 18 assists, while the team set a school record with 14 goals against Philadelphia Textile. Bev Hartley, Bandt and Mower named All-Americans.

1997

Make it two straight NCAA titles for the Huskies, who beat Kutztown 2-0 to win the title. Bloomsburg won its final 15 games on the way to the crown. Beth Canner, Amber Hess, Jess Kircher and Kelly Platt named All-Americans.

1998

For the third year running, the Huskies win the NCAA Division II title, this time with a 4-3 overtime win against Lock Haven. It was that same Lock Haven team a week earlier which stopped the Huskies' winning streak at 35. Bloomsburg sets a school record with 90 goals scored for the year. Canner, Kircher and Platt earn All-American honors.

1999

For the first time in NCAA field hockey history, a team has won four straight titles after a 2-0 win against Bentley. Bloomsburg, winners of 54 of its last 55 games, is led by Player of Year Jess Kircher and All-Americans Bridgett Heckman, Leah Conte, Krista Engle and Trish Leitzel.

2000

The Huskies won their first four games of the year before dropping a 1-0, overtime game to Indiana (PA). In the PSAC playoffs, the Huskies lost again to the Indians, 2-0. The loss knocked the Huskies from the NCAA playoff picture and denied them a shot at their fifth straight national title. Conte, Engle, Leitzel and Heather Weikel named All-Americans.

2001

After starting the season 5-3, the Hus-

kies rattled off nine straight wins, including a 3-2 overtime win against Lock Haven, to finish with 14 wins. However, for the first time in 20 years, the team did not advance to post-season play. Shanna Fritz, Marlea Partlon, Trish Leitzel and Nikki Hartranft were named All-Americans.

2002

Bloomsburg capped a perfect season with a near perfect game as it beat the Falcons of Bentley College, 5-0, for the NCAA Championship. The title was the 10th national title and first since 1999 for the Huskies and coach Jan Hutchinson. Shanna Fritz, Sharla Partlon, Nikki Hartranft, Trish Leitzel and Sheila Zilinski were named All-American.

2003

Bloomsburg closed out the season with a 12-game winning streak, including a 4-1 win over UMass-Lowell in the NCAA title game. The Huskies ended the year with a mark of 22-2. Fritz, Partlon, Hartranft and Zilinski were named All-American.

2004

Bloomsburg won its third consecutive national championship and its 12th overall when they defeated Bentley 3-2 in overtime. Kelly Trevisan scored the game-winning goal seven minutes, 51 seconds into overtime. Kristi Ney and Tracey Hudak were named All-Americans.

2005

The Huskies three-year run as NCAA Division II champions came to an end

with a 2-1, overtime loss to UMass-Lowell. Bloomsburg also lost in the PSAC title game by a 5-4 score to Shipensburg, but did finish the year with a mark of 19-5. Hudak, Ney and Maribeth Brozena were named All-Americans.

2006

Bloomsburg regained the NCAA championship with a 1-0 win over Bentley College in Pensacola, FL, to cap a perfect 24-0 season. Jamie Vanartsdalen led the team with 26 goals and 10 assists, while Samantha Kropa, who scored the only goal in the NCAA title game, added 23 goals. Vanartsdalen, Brozena and Tracey Hudak were each named All-American.

2007

The Huskies made it back-to-back national championships with a 5-2 victory over UMass-Lowell. This NCAA title was the 14th for head coach Jan Hutchinson and the fifth in the past six years for the Huskies. Vanartsdalen led Bloomsburg in goals (35), assists (19) and points (89) and was named National Player of the Year. Along with Vanartsdalen, Whitney Miller and Chelsea Due each received first-team All-American honors.

2008

Bloomsburg won three straight national championships for the fourth time in its history with a dominating 6-2 win over UMass-Lowell. The title was

the sixth in the last seven years and Jan Hutchinson's 15th in her illustrious career. Vanartsdalen ended her career with three goals and an assist, putting the Huskies on the board early with a goal at the 1:20 mark. Vanartsdalen earned National Player of the Year honors for the second straight year, leading BU with 40 goals, 22 assists and 102 points. She finished her career ranking first in school history in several categories, including

career goals (120), assists (58) and points (298). Vanartsdalen, Due, Miller, Maggey Bloskey, Samantha Kropa and Vanessa Witman all earned All-American honors.

2009

The Huskies won their fourth straight national championship for the second time in school history with a 3-2 win over UMass-Lowell. It was Bloomsburg's second straight national championship game victory over the River Hawks and the first four-peat since 1996-99. Amanda Riley scored two goals in the win, helping retiring coach Jan Hutchinson go out on top with her 16th national title. Riley led the Huskies with 27 goals and 62 points and was named first-team All-American. Joining her were national players of the year Maggey Bloskey and Chelsea Due while Aubrey Carman and Caitlin Koczynski also received All-American honors.

A true NCAA coaching legend, Jan Hutchinson retired at the end of the 2009 season, after seeing the Huskies win their fourth consecutive NCAA Division II championship. As head field hockey coach, she was in charge of a program that has won 16 national championships and 17 conference titles. While as head softball coach, she is the NCAA Division II all-time leader in career wins and has made an NCAA-record 27 consecutive trips to the Division II championships. Hutchinson also is the winningest college coach in any division with 1,734 combined wins between field hockey and softball.

FIELD HOCKEY

While at Bloomsburg, Hutchinson's field hockey squads posted winning records in 31 of her 32 seasons and amassed an overall record of 591-75-20 for a winning percentage of .872. She is the winningest coach in NCAA field hockey history and is the only coach with over 500 victories.

Under Hutchinson, the Huskies have enjoyed many outstanding seasons and have won 16 or more games on 26 occasions. Her teams won national championships in 1981, 1983, 1984, 1987, 1993, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 and in 2009. Her first string of four straight titles (1996-99) was the first time in the history of NCAA field hockey that the feat was accomplished. Her teams have also registered nine national runner-up finishes.

In addition, the Huskies captured Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) championships in 1983, 1984, 1987, 1988, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1997, 1999, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009, garnering eight runner-up showings.

Hutchinson has been chosen as the national Division II Coach of the Year seven times in her career, including 1991, 1998, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009. Her 2006 team went undefeated and untied on its way to the NCAA D-II championship, the fourth time in school history for that to happen.

Her 2008 team set numerous school, conference and NCAA Division II marks, including a record for goals scored in a season with 161, shattering the mark of 132 set by the Huskies in 2007. She also coached Jamie Vanartsdalen, the NCAA all-time record holder for goals and points in a season and career.

Seven National Coach of the Year Awards

Four athletes on the 2009 team achieved NFH-CA All-American honors, bringing the total under Hutchinson to 54 performers who have combined to win 105 All-American awards. Under Hutchinson’s leadership, 12 Bloomsburg players, including Vanartsdalen in 2007 and 2008, have also been named national “Player of the Year,” the most of any coach in Division II.

SOFTBALL

One of the most successful coaches ever in Division II softball history, Jan Hutchinson retired at the end of the 2010 season.

During her career as coach of the Huskies, Hutchinson posted a record of 1,165-280-2 (.805) and has made an NCAA record 27 consecutive trips to the NCAA championship tournament (230 including AIAW and NCAA Division III). She has the most wins of any NCAA Division II coach in history and is sixth on the all-time wins list regardless of division. She is also second on the NCAA Division list and seventh overall for highest winning percentage.

Bloomsburg has been to the championship round nine times, twice finishing as the national runner-up with losses each time in extra innings in the national title game. She also has six third-place showings and two fourth-place finishes. The Huskies also won the 1982 AIAW national championship.

In softball, Bloomsburg holds 16 NCAA Division II individual, team or championship records. In only her fourth season, Hutchinson won the national championship “double” in the 1981-82 school year, claiming the field hockey title in the fall and the softball championship that spring.

Bloomsburg has dominated Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) competition winning 14 softball championships. In addition, her players have enjoyed recognition in softball

OVERALL

Hutchinson's achievements in coaching have not gone unnoticed by her peers. She has been honored with induction into both the National Fastpitch Coaches Association and the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Halls of Fame. In addition, Hutchinson was named the winner of the C. Vivian Stringer Award by the United States Sports Academy in the summer of 2006.

Hutchinson's coaching talents have not only helped those as student-athletes, but several of her former players have gone on to coach at the intercollegiate level. At Bloomsburg, she has former All-American performers as her top assistant coaches in softball.

Others have gone on to coaching jobs elsewhere, such as Janelle Breneman (assistant softball coach at the University of North Carolina), Marci Hickey (head softball coach at the University of Vermont), Leah Conte (former assistant field hockey and lacrosse coach at Mary Washington College) and Kathy Frick



(former head coach at Goucher College, Bloomsburg and current head coach of Lafayette University lacrosse.)

Two former softball players have also played professionally. Janelle Breneman was a member of the Georgia Pride and Marty Laudato was a member of the Tampa Bay Fire Stix. In 1999, Laudato was named WPSL Hitter of the Year.

A 1971 graduate of East Stroudsburg University, Hutchinson also earned a master's degree in education from the school in 1979. Prior to Bloomsburg, she initiated the women's physical education program at Blair Academy and served as head coach for field hockey, basketball and softball. She has also been inducted into the Newton High School and Sussex County (NJ) Halls of Fame. In 2000, the Bloomsburg softball field was named in her honor.

Zaleski was midfielder for four seasons at Bloomsburg. For her career, she scored 19 goals and 15 assists for a total of 53 points. She was All-American and Division II National Player of the Year in 1988. She also received the Joanne McComb Award/Outstanding Underclassman Female Athlete in the 1988-89 season. She is only one for six players to win National Player of the Year honors in the school's history. She was part of the 1987 Division II National Championship team as well as the 1987 and 1988 PSAC Championship team.

Donna Graupp
Class of 1987
Inducted 2007

Graupp played both field hockey and softball for the Huskies. As a two-year member of the field hockey team, Graupp was a two-time All-American and two-time All-PSAC selection while playing for the Huskies. She helped the Huskies to a two-year mark of 38-5-2, earning one NCAA runner-up and one NCAA third-place finish. She totaled 28 goals in her career and had three assists.

Karen Hertzler
Class of 1986
Inducted 2000

Hertzler was a two-sport standout, excelling in both field hockey and softball. In field hockey, she was a two-time All-American, earning National Player of the Year honors in 1985. She finished her career with 50 goals and 16 assists. She was named All-PSAC in 1985 and All-Region in 1982. She helped the Huskies to a four-year record of 70-9-2, two national titles, two PSAC titles, one second- and one third-place national finish. On the softball field, Hertzler was just as dominant, twice earning All-American along with All-PSAC honors once. For her career, she hit .345 with three home runs, 52 RBI, 127 runs scored, 34 stolen bases and 158 hits. She helped the team to four PSAC championships and a third-place finish at the NCAA national championships in 1986.

Donna Koons
Class of 1979

A three-sport star for the Huskies, Koons was a four-year starter in field hockey and played on the basketball and softball teams. She was named all-conference and all-sectional in field hockey. Koons served as assistant coach on the Huskies' first national championship field hockey team.

Sharon Reilly Zemaitis

Reilly Zemaitis was a two-time All-American in field hockey for the Huskies. She helped Bloomsburg to a four-year record of 82-9-4, two PSAC championships and one NCAA title. She finished her career second in career goals with 48 (now 4th) and second in career points with 108 (now 6th). As a junior, Zemaitis scored a team-high 18 goals. As a senior, she finished second in goals scored with 12 while adding three assists.

Gisela Smith
Class of 1992
Inducted 2009

Smith was a standout defender on the Bloomsburg field hockey team, where she played midfielder. Smith, a native of Trinidad, was the MVP of Trinidad's national team and played in many international competitions. At Bloomsburg, she was a two-time winner (1990 and 1991) of the Broderick Award as the field hockey National Player of the Year. In addition, Smith was a first-team All-American in 1990 and 1991, the PSAC Field Hockey Athlete of the Year in 1991, and a four-time first team All-PSAC honoree. She was also on the NCAA All-Tournament team in 1988, 1990 and 1991.

Despite being a defender, she still scored 13 goals and had 14 assists during her four-year career. During that time the Huskies won three PSAC championships and were three-time NCAA runners-up. The team compiled a record of 84-8-2 over that period and the defense allowed only 39

goals in those 94 games. Smith also served as team captain her senior year in 1991. In 2006, she was named to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

In 1993, Smith was the leading goal scorer for the New York City Open Women's Field Hockey team and also helped lead New York City to their first and only Gold medal for the sport in the history of the Empire State Games.

Deb Long Stoudt
Class of 1984
Inducted 1996

Stoudt was a three-time All-American field hockey player for the Huskies and part of the 1981 national championship field hockey team and the 1982 national championship softball team. She scored the lone goal in both PSAC and national field hockey title games as a senior. In 1982, Stoudt made the East team at the U.S. Sports Festival in Indianapolis, ranking her among the nation's top 65 performers. In 1981, she was one of the youngest players to reach the Olympic tryout stage.

Carla Shearer (Christian)
Class of 1988
Inducted 2003

Shearer was a two-sport standout for the Huskies playing both basketball and field hockey. On the hardwood, she finished her career 13th on Bloomsburg University's all-time scoring list with a total of 889 career points and was fifth all-time in assists with a career total of 334. In addition, Shearer was ninth all-time in steals with a career total of 184.

As a field hockey player, Shearer was a two-time All-American (1985-86) and helped the Huskies to two NCAA championships and two second-place finishes. Her best season was 1986 when she netted 15 goals and added 15 assists. Shearer finished her career with 27 goals and 29 assists. Her 29 assists were a school-record at the time (since surpassed).

Laurie Snyder
Class of 1984
Inducted 2002

Snyder was a three-time All-American for the Bloomsburg field hockey team and a four-year letterwinner in softball. During her field hockey career, Snyder had 28 shutouts and led the Huskies to two national championships. She posted a 0.72 goals-against-average in 1981 to lead the Huskies to the AIAW national championship. Snyder also posted 10 shutouts that season and added 12 in 1983 as the Huskies won their first NCAA title. She finished her career with 23 shutouts.

In softball, Snyder played four years for the Huskies, helping the team to an overall record of 114-21 and the first two PSAC championships ever held in 1983 and 1984. She was also Bloomsburg's starting first baseman on the 1982 AIAW national championship team, the first-ever national title won at Bloomsburg. As a freshman, she led Bloomsburg in hitting with a .395 average.

Snyder was also a standout in the classroom and was selected as an Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America in 1983.
