FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- Bloomsburg is 7-4-1 lifetime against Clarion and has won the last five meetings between the two schools. During the winning streak against the Golden Eagles, Bloomsburg has outscored Clarion, 197-63.

- Both teams are coming off of season-opening losses a week ago. The Huskies fell behind 17-0 against Stonehill in the opening nine minutes and dropped a 44-28 decision to the Skyhawks last Saturday. Bloomsburg was held to just 79 yards rushing - only the fifth time in the Paul Darragh era that the Huskies have had less than 100 yards on the ground in a game. Meanwhile, Clarion opened at Tennessee-Martin - a Division I FCS opponent - and suffered a 36-0 loss. The Golden Eagles were limited to 146 yards of total offense.

- Bloomsburg enters the 2017 season having posted a winning record for 18 consecutive years dating back to a 5-6 mark in 1998. The Huskies have recorded a winning record in 22 of the last 23 seasons.

- The Huskies have scored at least one point in 163 consecutive games and have record at least one touchdown in 118 straight contests. On the road, the Huskies have scored at least one point in 110 consecutive contests dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1999. Bloomsburg has scored at least 10 points on the road in 59 straight games.

- Since 1999, Bloomsburg has gone 48-18 against opponents from the PSAC Western Division which includes a 22-12 mark away from Redman Stadium.

BY THE NUMBERS

1 - Wins in four seasons, under head coach Paul Darragh, during which the Huskies ran for fewer than 100 yards on the ground. That win came against Shippensburg on November 5, 2016

2 - Touchdown passes by Chris Palubinsky last week. It was the first time in his career that he threw for more than one touchdown in a game and he became the first BU quarterback to throw for more than one TD in a game since Tim Kelly had two touchdown passes against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015

3 - Postseason award-winners from last season that are on the 2017 roster - Michael Allen, Chris Gary, and Eric McCracken

5 - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era. Including last Saturday's loss, the Huskies are 1-4 in such games

7 - Total touchdowns thrown by Bloomsburg quarterbacks last season

18 - Consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 22 of the last 23 years.

38 - Games under head coach Paul Darragh (48 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack

52.2% - Percentage of Bloomsburg's total offense through the air last season. It marked the first time since the 2009 season that a BU team had more passing yards than rushing yards in a season (1,796-1,767)

59 - Consecutive road games in which the Huskies have scored more than 10 points

61 - Bloomsburg is 61-16 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game since 2009

65 - Rushing yards by Duffy Gilhool against East Stroudsburg on October 22, 2016 - the most by a Bloomsburg quarterback since Tim Kelly rushed for 66 yards in a 34-13 win over East Stroudsburg on November 1, 2014

75.1% - Percentage of last week's passing yardage that went to Jay Popson (121) and Michael Allen (78). Three other receivers combined for 66 receiving yards

110 - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1999

112 - Bloomsburg is 112-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. Bloomsburg has recorded a program-record of seven games with at least 40 points four times (2005, 2007, 2012, and 2013). However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only three times in the last 25 contests

118 - Consecutive games of scoring at least one touchdown

121 - Receiving yards by Jay Popson in his first collegiate start last Saturday. He became the first player to eclipse 100 yards receiving in a game since Connor Gades had 102 receiving yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015

125 - The 2017 season marks the 125th anniversary of the start of football at Bloomsburg. This will be the 120th season overall of football at the school.

155 - Bloomsburg victories since the start of the 2000 season - fifth-most in Division II during the stretch

163 - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point

175 - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (175-58, .751). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator

283 - Rushing yards by Bloomsburg in 35-14 win over East Stroudsburg on October 22, 2016 - last year's team high and the most since rushing for 309 against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015. It was the most in a regulation game since rushing for 291 against Cheyney on October 3, 2015

334 - Team rushing yards needed by the Huskies to reach 50,000 since the start of the 1999 season

1,000 - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons, 13 of the last 14, and in 15 of the last 17 years

1998 - The last time a Bloomsburg team had given up more total yards that it gained in a season (4,069-4,045) prior to last year. Last season, the Huskies allowed 4,198 total yards and amassed 3,922

NOTES

LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg allowed 17 points in the opening nine minutes of the contest last Saturday as it fell to visiting Stonehill, 44-28. The Huskies managed 344 yards of total offense but were held to just 79 yards on the ground - just the fifth time in 48 games under head coach Paul Darragh that the team has been held to under 100 yards rushing. Qmac Quiteh led the Huskies with 74 yards rushing and a score on 15 carries while Chris Palubinsky completed 19-of-37 passes for 265 yards and two touchdowns. Jay Popson and Michael Allen combined to catch 13 passes for 199 yards. Stonehill, meanwhile, amassed 439 yards of total offense in the victory. Brian Kearns, Jr. led the Skyhawks with 135 yards - 132 in the second half - on 24 carries while Matt Foltz completed 22-of-35 passes for 275 yards and three scores.

Clarion dropped a 36-0 decision at FCS opponent, Tennessee-Martin, last Thursday, August 31. The Golden Eagles mustered only nine first downs and 146 yards of total offense but did cause four Skyhawks' turnovers in the loss.

POPSON BREAKS OUT

Redshirt sophomore Jay Popson made his first collegiate start at wide receiver last Saturday and took advantage of the opportunity by catching seven passes for 121 yards. He entered the contest with two career catches and 27 career receiving yards but emerged as redshirt senior Chris Palubinsky's main target against Stonehill. His 121 receiving yards marked the first time a Bloomsburg receiver eclipsed 100 yards receiving yards in a game since Connor Gades hauled in 102 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015.

SELDOM HAPPENS

The Huskies rushed for only 79 yards in Saturday's loss to Stonehill - just the fifth time in 48 games under head coach Paul Darragh that the team has been held to under 100 yards rushing. The Huskies are 1-4 in such games with the only victory coming against Shippensburg on November 5, 2016 when the ground game picked up 96 yards in a 22-19 win. Redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh led the Huskies with career-highs in carries (15) and rushing yards (74) on Saturday while also scoring his third career rushing touchdown. The rest of the team accounted for 16 carries for five yards.

FOR OPENERS

The season-opening loss to Stonehill marked just the second time in the last 18 home openers, dating back to the 2000 season, that the Huskies found themselves on the wrong end of the scoreboard. The Skyhawks also earned a victory at Redman Stadium back in 2015. Meanwhile, the 44 points allowed by the Huskies were the most allowed by a Bloomsburg team in a season-opener since a 47-37 setback against New Haven to open the 1999 campaign. It also marked the most given up in a game since a 58-20 loss at Shippensburg in the 2012 NCAA playoffs on November 17, 2012.

STRONG OUTINGS

Redshirt senior Chris Palubinsky had, arguably, his best day throwing the football on Saturday as he completed 19-of-37 passes for 265 yards and two touchdowns. He established career-highs in completions (19), attempts (37), and touchdowns (2) while finishing two yards shy of tying his career-high of 267 yards at Kutztown on October 8, 2016. It marked the first time in his career that he threw for more than one touchdown in a game and it was the first time a Bloomsburg quarterback threw for multiple touchdowns since Tim Kelly had a pair of touchdown passes against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015.

In addition to Palubinsky, several other Huskies had career-high efforts in last Saturday's opener. Offensively, redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh set career bests in rushing attempts (15) and rushing yards (74) and redshirt sophomore Jay Popson shattered his previous highs with seven catches for 121 yards. Defensively, redshirt seniors Ezra Ran-

co and Scott Beltz posted new career-highs in tackles with eight and seven respectively. Redshirt junior Josh Salak chipped in with six stops - also a career best. Redshirt junior Jake Klingler tied a career-high with five tackles in the loss.

NEW FACES

Several freshman saw significant playing time on Saturday and appear to be ready to contribute. On defense, Jordan Villafane started at cornerback and posted five solo tackles while redshirt freshman Koran Jordan saw his first collegiate action and had six total stops (five assisted) and a pass break up. On special teams, Chris Monaco led the Huskies with two kickoff returns for 48 yards.

CAPTAINS NAMED

Bloomsburg will go with a trio of captains this season - redshirt seniors Aaron Allison, Scott Beltz, and Eric Schwartz. Allison, a tight end from Philadelphia, has appeared in 36 games entering the 2017 season and has career 37 catches for 443 yards and five scores. Beltz, a defensive lineman from Pen Argyl, enters the season with 86 total tackles and 4.5 sacks in 32 career contests. Schwartz, a safety from York, has played in 32 career games and has 60 total tackles and an interception.

SERVICEMEN

Schwartz spent four years in the service, serving as a lance corporal before promotion to corporal. During his time in the Marines, Schwartz was deployed for nine months in Kunjak, Helmand Province, Afghanistan, where he worked as an infantry machine gunner. Deployed in 2009, he spent his days in a combat position on top of a truck, responsible for tactical employment of a heavy machine gun to provide direct fire in support of his unit. He also served a tour of duty in the Mediterranean Sea with an expeditionary unit. Meanwhile, redshirt freshman Alex Findura also served in the United States Marine Corps Infantry for four years.

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. Bloomsburg finished in a tie for third last year with a 6-5 overall record and a 4-3 mark in divisional play. The six victories snapped a streak of 17 straight seasons of seven or more victories but extended the program's streak to 18 straight years of having a winning season. The Huskies have had a winning record in 22 of the last 23 seasons.

JONASSEN TO ENTER BU HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Eric Jonassen will be inducted into the Bloomsburg University Hall of Fame on October 27 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2017. Jonassen is the father of starting center, Seth Jonassen.

Eric Jonassen was a dominant offensive lineman for two seasons on the Huskies' football team and earned a number of postseason accolades during his time at Bloomsburg. He was a two-time First Team All-PSAC selection and collected numerous All-American honors including being named Second Team AP All-American in 1990, First Team AP All-American in 1991, and First Team AFCA All-American in 1991. He was also tabbed a First Team Football Gazette All-American twice. After his collegiate career, Jonassen was drafted in the fifth round of the 1992 NFL draft by the San Diego Chargers. He played three seasons in San Diego, participating in Super Bowl XXIX, and then played two seasons with the Arizona Cardinals before retiring after the 1997 season.

Other members of this year's class are Michele Baylor Kane (women's lacrosse), Kathy Frick (field hockey, women's lacrosse coach), Chuck Laudermilch (women's soccer coach), Ralph Moerschbacher (men's swimming), and Michelle Wolyniec (women's cross country/track and field).

The ceremony will take place on Friday, October 27 and then the six individuals will be honored at halftime of Bloomsburg's home game against Lock Haven on Saturday, October 28.

SCOUTING CLARION

Clarion was picked to finish seventh in the PSAC West according to the pre-season coaches poll. The Golden Eagles went 4-7 last season and posted a 3-4 mark in divisional play. Chris Weibel is in his third season coaching his alma mater and, after the season-opening loss at Tennessee-Martin last week, sports an 11-12 overall record.

Against the Skyhawks, Clarion was held to just 146 yards of total offense and nine first downs in the 36-0 loss. The defense did, however, force four turnovers (two fumbles, two interceptions). On the ground, Kyle Evans led Clarion with 24 carries for 50 yards while Mylique McGriff added 46 yards on 10 carries. Asiantii Woulard struggled throwing the football as he completed just 2-of-22 passes for 53 yards and two interceptions. Seneca Williams caught both passes. Defensively, Layne Skundrich led the Golden Eagles with 10 total tackles and a fumble recovery while Quinlin Lambert chipped in nine tackles and half a tackle for a loss. Avery Howsare and Myles Edmonds had the interceptions.

Clarion was outgained, 457-146, and allowed 265 yards on the ground to the Skyhawks.

UP NEXT

Bloomsburg will return home to Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium next Saturday, September 16, when it hosts Gannon University. Kickoff is scheduled for 2:00 p.m.

The Huskies will be looking to avenge last season's 30-27 overtime setback to the Golden Knights in Erie, Pennsylvania. Bloomsburg leads the all-time series against Gannon, 3-2.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

- The 44 points given up on Saturday was just the fourth time in program history an opponent has scored 40 or more points in a season opener at Bloomsburg and the first since 1999 when New Haven put up 47. The only other games were in 1975 when Shippensburg had 41 and 58 by Ithaca in 1980. While Bloomsburg posted 1-8 records both of those seasons, they rebounded in 1999 to finish 7-4.

- The Huskies have now surrendered 40 or more points 12 times in 120 season openers: four at home and eight on the road, dating back to the first one in 1893. The only victory in those 12 games was at Ashland in 2008, when they came back from 21 points down to win 49-42.

- Saturday was the third time in school history a game has ended 44-28. Bloomsburg lost by that score at West Chester in 2007 and won at Stonehill in 2012.

- The Huskies will have their first game on the road this week. They have scored in 110 consecutive road contests, dating back to a shut-out at Millersville in 1998. They have also scored ten or more points in 59 straight road contests since the start of the 2007 season. Both are school records.

- Bloomsburg has been very successful in recent years in games versus the PSAC West. Since 1999 its record is 48-18, with a record of 26-6 at home and 22-12 on the road.

- The upcoming game with Clarion is the 13th in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting in 1934. Bloomsburg's record in the previous 12 games is 7-4-1, with a mark of 4-2 at home and 3-2-1 on the road. The Huskies have beaten the Golden Eagles five consecutive times overall, with the only two losses at Clarion coming in 1993 and 1996.

A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last seven seasons, 13 of the last 14, and in 15 of the last 17 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 21st season with the Huskies in 2017 and fifth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2017 campaign with a 34-13 overall record (.723). The 34 victories over his first four seasons marks the most wins in the first four years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .723 winning percentage is the second-best mark during the first four years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 30-4 (.882) from 1947 to 1950). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 175-57 (.754).

Last season, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark. The Huskies have not had a losing record since going 5-6 during the 1998 season - Darragh's second year on the staff.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.



The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/ game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 29, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 16.
