### **FIVE THINGS TO WATCH**

- The game with Clarion is the 14th in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting in 1934. Bloomsburg has an 8-4-1 record in the series, with a mark of 4-2 at home and 4-2-1 on the road. The only home losses to the Golden Eagles were in 1946 and 1992. The Huskies have won the last six in the series beginning with a 24-10 victory in 2006.

- The Huskies and Golden Eagles will meet for the second time this season on Saturday. While BU has played the same team twice in a year seven times since 2005, all were once in the regular season and then again in the postseason. The last time they faced the same team twice in the regular season was in 1945 (home-and-home series with East Stroudsburg and Lock Haven) against a Bloomsburg team made up of naval cadets training at the school during the Second World War. The last time the same team was faced twice in a non-war regular season was Scranton High School in 1901.

- Redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh needs 96 rushing yards to give him 1,000 for the season. The Huskies have had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last seven seasons, in 13 of the last 14, and in 15 of the last 17 years.

- Redshirt juniors Jake Klinger (18 TFL, 9 sacks) and Chris Gary (11 TFL, 7 sacks) lead a Huskies' defensive unit that has posted a PSAC-leading 31 sacks on the season. Clarion, meanwhile, has allowed the most sacks (30) in the PSAC. Klinger's 18 tackles for a loss is the most by a BU player since Justin Shirk had 21.5 during the 2014 season. However, Shirk played 13 games that year.

- The victory at East Stroudsburg on October 21 clinched Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

## BY THE NUMBERS

- 3** - The victory at East Stroudsburg marked just the third time under Darragh that the Huskies came from behind to win despite trailing after three quarters (3-13)
- 3** - The win over the Warriors was also just the third time under Darragh that Bloomsburg won despite turning the ball over more than three times (3-6)
- 4** - The win over West Chester marked the fourth time under Darragh that the Huskies won a game despite allowing a 100-yard rusher (4-10). The Huskies have won twice this season (Gannon) after going 2-8 in such games during Darragh's first four seasons
- 6** - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era. After the loss to Kutztown, the Huskies are 1-5 in such games
- 7** - Number of times that a Bloomsburg team has not forced a turnover in 57 games under Paul Darragh. The Huskies improved to 4-3 in such games with the 28-21 win at Millersville
- 19** - Consecutive winning seasons which was clinched with last week's win at East Stroudsburg. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years
- 46** - Games under head coach Paul Darragh (57 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies have been held without a sack once this season
- 60.8%** - Of the 1,737 passing yards by the Huskies this season, Michael Allen (556) and Jay Popson (500) have combined for 1,056 of those yards
- 62** - Consecutive road games in which the Huskies had scored more than 10 points. That streak was snapped last Saturday at Shippensburg
- 67** - Bloomsburg is 67-18 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game since 2009
- 96** - Rushing yards needed by Qmac Quiteh to reach 1,000 yards for the season. It would give the Huskies a 1,000-yard back in each of the last eight seasons
- 113** - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 35 contests
- 114** - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998
- 125** - The 2017 season marks the 125th anniversary of the start of football at Bloomsburg. This will be the 120th season overall of football at the school
- 126** - Consecutive games that Bloomsburg had scored at least one touchdown. That streak was snapped last Saturday at Shippensburg
- 166** - Total yards of offense by the Huskies in the 23-7 loss to Kutztown. It marks the fewest yards in a game by Bloomsburg since totaling 136 yards in a 21-0 loss to Shippensburg on September 13, 2003
- 172** - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point
- 181** - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (181-61, .748). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator
- 300** - The Huskies ran for 300 yards in the win at East Stroudsburg. It marked the first time since rushing for 309 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 that Bloomsburg reached 300 rushing yards in a game. The Huskies are now 11-0 under Darragh when hitting that mark
- 1,000** - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons, 13 of the last 14, and in 15 of the last 17 years

# NOTES

## LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg allowed 20 first-quarter points and could not dig itself out of the hole as the Huskies dropped a 20-6 decision at Shippensburg. Bloomsburg was limited to just a pair of field goals from Ryan Abbott on Saturday as the Huskies saw their streak of 126 consecutive games of scoring a touchdown come to an end. The Huskies also saw their string of 62 straight games of reaching double figures in scoring on the road come to a halt. Nate Monroe posted a career-high 11 total tackles to lead the way in that department. Alex Annan had a career-high 10 stops while Jake Klinger continued to torment opposing quarterbacks as he finished with a career-high-tying ten tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, and 2.5 sacks. Chris Gary had a pair of sacks and forced two fumbles - one of which he recovered. Dexter Jordan had two interceptions - his first two of the season - while Eric Schwartz had the other.

The Golden Eagles fell in a road shootout on Saturday, dropping a 38-28 decision to Gannon at McConnell Family Stadium. The Clarion defense did its best to limit the high-powered Gannon offense, intercepting four passes and recovering one fumble for a five-turnover day on the road. They harassed Golden Knights quarterback Jimmy Keefe to the tune of a -1.3 quarterback rating, holding him to 5-of-11 for 34 yards and the four picks. Myliques McGriff exploded in the running game for Clarion, finishing with 216 rushing yards and a touchdown on 29 carries, giving him a 7.4 yards per carry average on the afternoon. Kyle Evans made the most of his lone carry on the day, punching in a touchdown from one yard out in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 28.

## STREAKS SNAPPED

Bloomsburg entered last Saturday's game at Shippensburg having scored at least one touchdown in 126 consecutive games and having reached double figures in 62 straight contests. However, both those strings came to a screeching halt on Saturday as the Huskies were limited to only a pair of field goals from redshirt junior Ryan Abbott in the loss.

## HOUSE OF HORRORS

Bloomsburg has struggled at Redman Stadium this season as the loss to Lock Haven dropped the Huskies to 2-3 on their home turf. Prior to this season, the Huskies had not lost three home games in a single season since 1999, when they finished 3-3 at Redman Stadium. The last losing season at home was in 1993 (2-3) and the last four-loss season came in 1992 when the team was 0-4.

## SACK ATTACK

Bloomsburg has recorded 29 sacks over the last eight games after collecting only two through the first two weeks. Bloomsburg now leads the PSAC with 31 sacks on the season - 15th-most in the country. Saturday's opponent, Clarion, has allowed a PSAC-high 30 sacks on the year. Individually, redshirt junior Jake Klinger ranks second in the PSAC with nine sacks on the season. Redshirt junior Chris Gary is tied for fourth with seven while redshirt senior Scott Beltz has four sacks to put him in a tie for 20th in the conference.

## GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD

Redshirt junior Jake Klinger is enjoying a breakout campaign in 2017 as he has become a force to be reckoned with for opposing offensive lines and quarterbacks. Klinger has moved into second in the PSAC in both categories as he has 18 tackles for a loss and nine quarterback sacks on the season. He trails only Slippery Rock's Marcus Martin in both categories. He has 14.5 tackles for a loss and eight sacks over the course of the last six weeks. With two tackles behind the line of scrimmage on Saturday, he would become the first Husky with 20 tackles for a loss in a season since Justin Shirk finished with 21.5 during the 2014 campaign.

## ANOTHER QUTEH LEADS THEM

Redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh rushed for a career-high 168 yards during the 38-28 win at East Stroudsburg. It was his fourth 100-yard game of the season - he picked up his first collegiate 100-yard rushing effort as he carried the ball 29 times for 118 yards in the victory at Clarion on September 9, while also hitting the century mark against Cheyney and West Chester. Quiteh leads the Huskies with 904 yards rushing and seven touchdowns on 187 carries. He ranks seventh in the PSAC in rushing yards per game (90.9) and he has led the Huskies in rushing in eight of the ten games. Quiteh is the younger brother of Bloomsburg's - and the PSAC's - all-time leading rusher, Franklyn Quiteh who compiled 7,523 rushing yards from 2010-13. Franklyn won the Harlon Hill Trophy as the nation's top player in Division II during his senior season of 2013 after rushing for 2,195 yards and 29 scores. He was a three-time Harlon Hill finalist.

## PALUBINSKY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Redshirt senior quarterback Chris Palubinsky ran for a pair of touchdowns during the 27-24 loss to Lock Haven. The scores gave him ten rushing touchdowns on the season - most by a Bloomsburg quarterback in a single season in school history. The previous record was eight held by both Dan Latorre in 2008 and Tim Kelly in 2015. Latorre also rushed for seven in 2007 while Kelly (2013 and 2014) and Eric Miller (1999) each rushed for six in a single season.

Also against Lock Haven, Palubinsky became the tenth quarterback in school history to throw for at least 3,000 in his career as he accomplished the feat with his final completion of the day - a 10-yard connection with redshirt sophomore Jay Popson on the game's final drive. Palubinsky has thrown for 3,121 yards in his career and trails Pat Carey (2009-11) by 527 yards to move into ninth on the school's all-time list.

## DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN

Bloomsburg scored 17 points in the first half of the loss to Lock Haven and built up a ten-point lead (17-7). It marked only the fifth time in 427 home games, since the 1923 season, that the Huskies had led by ten or more at the half and lost. The Huskies' record with those scenarios over that period of time is now 129-5. The only two losses with leads greater than ten came in 1989 when Bloomsburg led Cheney at the half 21-0 and lost 31-28, and in 1969 against Adelphi when a 14-0 lead at the break

ended in a 16-14 defeat. Bloomsburg's record in home games since 1923 when scoring 17 or more in the first half is now 118-8.

### GOING STREAKING

Bloomsburg's victory over Cheyney earlier this season marked the 28th consecutive win over the Wolves in the all-time series. Bloomsburg has not lost to Cheyney since a 31-28 setback, in Bloomsburg, on October 14, 1989. The winning streak represents a school-record against a single opponent. Meanwhile, with the win the following week at Millersville, the Huskies have now won 18 consecutive contests against the Marauders dating back to a 31-21 loss at home during the 1999 campaign. The Huskies also clinched their 19th consecutive winning season with the victory at East Stroudsburg. Bloomsburg's last losing season came in 1998 when the Huskies went 5-6. It is the third longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 seasons.

### 300 GAME

Bloomsburg rushed for a season-high 300 yards at East Stroudsburg, averaging 6.1 yards on 49 carries. It marked the most rushing yards in a game by the Huskies since running for 309 yards in a double-overtime victory over Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 and the team improved to 11-0 under head coach Paul Darragh when rushing for at least 300 yards in a game.

### DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE

At East Stroudsburg, redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh established a new career-high with 168 yards and two scores on 24 carries. Redshirt sophomore Alex Gooden also got over the century mark with 108 yards on 19 carries. The duo became the first pair of Bloomsburg backs to rush for more than 100 yards in the same game since Eddie Mateo (269) and Dai'Shon Munger (143) accomplished the feat in a 41-10 win over then-#7 West Chester on October 25, 2014.

### GROUND GAME

Bloomsburg totaled only 332 total yards on the ground during the first three contests of the season (110.7 per game) but has combined to rush for 1,401 yards (200.1 per game) in the last seven contests. With 200-plus rushing yards in four of the last seven games, Bloomsburg has now totaled at least 200 rushing yards in a game 34 times in 57 career games under head coach Paul Darragh. Bloomsburg is 31-3 in those contests.

### THROUGH THE AIR

Bloomsburg is averaging only 173.7 passing yards per game - 13th fewest in the conference. Only Cheyney (172.6), Lock Haven (164.8), and Clarion (163.3) average fewer than the Huskies. However, the duo of redshirt sophomore Michael Allen and redshirt sophomore Jay Popson have emerged as one of the top receiving tandems in the conference. Allen leads the team in both receptions (44) and yards (556) while Popson is second as he has hauled in 31 passes for 500 yards. The duo has combined for 75 of the team's 137 receptions (54.7%) and 1,056 of the team's 1,737 receiving yards (60.8%). Popson caught seven passes for 121 yards in the season opener against Stonehill - the first time a Bloomsburg receiver eclipsed 100 yards receiving yards in a game since Connor Gades hauled in 102 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015. Meanwhile, Allen caught seven passes for a career-high 91 yards against Kutztown. As a team, the Huskies only had 10 catches for 104 yards against the Golden Bears.

### MONROE EARNS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Redshirt junior linebacker Nate Monroe was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts during Saturday's 20-19 victory at West Chester. It marks the first time in his collegiate career that he has been honored with a weekly accolade from the conference and he became the fourth different Huskies' player to earn a weekly honor this season. Monroe blocked an extra point attempt late in the second quarter which proved to be the difference as the Huskies earned a one-point victory on the road at West Chester to knock the Golden Rams from the ranks of the unbeaten in divisional play on Saturday. Monroe was also involved in a tackle of West Chester quarterback Paul Dooley short of the goal line on a two-point conversion midway through the fourth quarter. That play kept the Golden Rams' lead at five points and enabled the Huskies to pick up the go-ahead score with 1:39 left in regulation. Monroe also led the Huskies with seven total tackles and had a half a tackle for a loss during the win.

### GARY EARNS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Redshirt junior Chris Gary was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts during the Huskies' 48-19 victory over Cheyney. Gary, the PSAC leader in sacks a season ago, was up to his old tricks on Saturday as he finished the day with five total tackles, four tackles for a loss, three sacks, a forced fumble, and a quarterback hurry. Gary's three sacks tied a career high and his four tackles for a loss established a new career best. His second sack of the game also proved to be his second forced fumble of the season and led to a 51-yard fumble return for a touchdown by freshman Aaron Trumino.

### SCHWARTZ EARNS FIRST WEEKLY AWARD

Senior Eric Schwartz was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in the Huskies' 27-10 win over Gannon. Schwartz, arguably, had the best game of his collegiate career as he led the Huskies with nine total tackles (seven solo), a sack, and an interception during the Huskies' 17-point win. He was also an integral part in limiting Gannon's offense to only 10 points (34 below Gannon's season average) and 321 yards of total offense (176.5 below Gannon's season average). The nine tackles established a new career-high for Schwartz and the sack was the first of his collegiate career (37 career games). His interception came late in the fourth quarter - at the Bloomsburg 37-yard line - and led to an Abbott field goal with under a minute remaining to put the game out of reach. It was Schwartz' first interception since November 8, 2014 during a victory at Lock Haven.

## ABBOTT EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Redshirt junior placekicker Ryan Abbott was named the PSAC East Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts in the Huskies' 29-20 victory at Clarion. Abbott was a perfect 3-of-3 on field goals and 2-of-2 on extra points as he helped the Huskies to their first win of the 2017 campaign. It marked a new career-high in field goals made in a game for Abbott – his previous high was two set on two different occasions last season (at Cheyney on September 24 and at IUP on November 12). He connected on a 30-yard field goal late in the first half which, at the time, gave the Huskies a 17-13 lead over the Golden Eagles. His 35-yarder on the Huskies' first drive of the second half tied the game at 20-20 and then his 33-yard boot late in the third quarter gave Bloomsburg the lead for good at 23-20.

## SERVICEMEN

Schwartz spent four years in the service, serving as a lance corporal before promotion to corporal. During his time in the Marines, Schwartz was deployed for nine months in Kunjak, Helmand Province, Afghanistan, where he worked as an infantry machine gunner. Deployed in 2009, he spent his days in a combat position on top of a truck, responsible for tactical employment of a heavy machine gun to provide direct fire in support of his unit. He also served a tour of duty in the Mediterranean Sea with an expeditionary unit. Meanwhile, redshirt freshman Alex Findura also served in the United States Marine Corps Infantry for four years. Findura's training and experience led him to become a member of an elite team called the Body Bearers, stationed in Washington D.C. As a part of the Body Bearers, Findura was tasked with aiding in the funerals of fallen soldiers.

## PRESEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. Bloomsburg finished in a tie for third last year with a 6-5 overall record and a 4-3 mark in divisional play. The six victories snapped a streak of 17 straight seasons of seven or more victories but extended the program's streak to 18 straight years of having a winning season. The Huskies have had a winning record in 22 of the last 23 seasons.

## JONASSEN ENTERS BU HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Eric Jonassen was inducted into the Bloomsburg University Hall of Fame on October 27 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2017. Jonassen is the father

of starting center, Seth Jonassen. Eric Jonassen was a dominant offensive lineman for two seasons on the Huskies' football team and earned a number of postseason accolades during his time at Bloomsburg. He was a two-time First Team All-PSAC selection and collected numerous All-American honors including being named Second Team AP All-American in 1990, First Team AP All-American in 1991, and First Team AFCA All-American in 1991. He was also tabbed a First Team Football Gazette All-American twice. After his collegiate career, Jonassen was drafted in the fifth round of the 1992 NFL draft by the San Diego Chargers. He played three seasons in San Diego, participating in Super Bowl XXIX, and then played two seasons with the Arizona Cardinals before retiring after the 1997 season. Other members of this year's class were Michele Baylor Kane (women's lacrosse), Kathy Frick (field hockey, women's lacrosse coach), Chuck Lauderemilch (women's soccer coach), Ralph Moerschbacher (men's swimming), and Michelle Wolyniec (women's cross country/track and field).

## SCOUTING CLARION

Clarion enters Saturday's matchup seventh in the PSAC West with a record of 1-9 (1-6 in the PSAC). The Golden Eagles lone win on the season came against Seton Hill in a 33-28 contest on Oct. 7. Clarion was projected to finish seventh in the coaches' preseason poll after a 4-7 finish a year ago when they claimed fifth in the PSAC West.

The Golden Eagles have been struggling on the offensive side of the ball only scoring 154 points for an average of 15.4 points per game; finding the end zone only 19 times this season. Freshman running back Mylique McGriff has been a bright spot for the struggling Clarion offense. McGriff has rushed for 768 yards on the season, 216 of which came last week against Gannon University. His 76.8 yards per game put him at eighth in the PSAC trailing Bloomsburg's own Qmac Quiteh. The Golden Eagles are led through the air by sophomore quarterback Jeff Clemens. Throwing for 753 yards in his seven games this year, Clemens is 14th in the PSAC averaging 107.6 yards per game. Clarion has been receiving a helping hand from junior running back Kyle Evans' special teams play this season. Evans has accounted for 429 return yards in 24 attempts. Clarion enters the weekend with the 15th ranked offense in the PSAC.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Bald Eagles have allowed an average of 375.4 yards per game this season, placing them at seventh in the PSAC. Junior linebacker Layne Skundrich who has accounted for 98 total tackles on the season leads Clarion's defense. Skundrich 9.8 tackles per game gives him sole claim to third in the PSAC. Fellow senior linebacker Avery Howsare has been strong contributor to the defense forcing three fumbles and accounting for 41 tackles on the season. Clarion has controlled the air, hauling in 12 interceptions on the year. Safety, Sam Fareri has accounted for three of the teams interceptions on the season.

# FROM THE ARCHIVES

- There was no scoring in the second half last Saturday. The last time a Bloomsburg game had a scoreless second half was on October 25, 2008, a 21-0 win at Shippensburg. The last time the Huskies lost a game with no score after the break was on September 13, 2003, at home to Shippensburg, also by a score of 21-0. Saturday's game was just the eighth time in 858 games since 1923 that an opponent scored 20 more points in the first quarter. It was only the fourth time since 1923 that an opponent scored ten or more in the first quarter and was held scoreless the rest of the game. The other three were a 42-14 win at Mansfield in 1998, a 14-12 victory at New Haven in 1953, and a 12-0 loss at East Stroudsburg in 1928.

- The Huskies scored just six points at Shippensburg. This is the fewest number of points in any game since a 33-3 loss in the 2006 finale at Northwest Missouri and the least in a road game since a shutout at Millersville on October 10, 1998. It also snapped a string of 126 straight games scoring at least one touchdown and 62 games of reaching double figures on the road.

- The 20-6 loss to Shippensburg was the first time in 1,071 games that Bloomsburg has lost by that score. Four previous 20-6 games ended in wins, all played between 1937 and 1972.

- The loss in the Eastern Division finale put the Huskies in fourth place, meaning that for the first time since 1992, when they finished sixth, Bloomsburg did not end in the top three in the division. This broke a record streak of 24 consecutive seasons. The team has now finished third or higher in the Eastern Division for 33 of the past 35 seasons since 1983.

- The Huskies will host Clarion on Saturday, after having played at Clarion the second week of the season. While they have played the same team twice in a year seven times since 2005, all were once in the regular season and then again in the post-season. The last time they faced the same team twice in the regular season was in 1945, home-and-home series with East Stroudsburg and Lock Haven, against a Bloomsburg team made up of naval cadets training at the school during the Second World War. The year before, the navy team played two each against the University of Scranton and Drexel. The last time the same team was faced twice in a non-war regular season was Scranton High School in 1901.

# A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last seven seasons, 13 of the last 14, and in 15 of the last 17 campaigns. Redshirt sophomore Qmac Quiteh needs 96 yards on Saturday to reach the milestone. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

# PAUL DARRAGH

**5th Season (21st Season at BU)  
40-17 Overall Record  
Temple '85**



Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 21st season with the Huskies in 2017 and fifth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2017 campaign with a 34-13 overall record (.723). The 34 victories over his first four seasons marks the most wins in the first four years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .723 winning percentage is the second-best mark during the first four years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 30-4 (.882) from 1947 to 1950). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 175-57 (.754).

Last season, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark. The Huskies have not had a losing record since going 5-6 during the 1998 season - Darragh's second year on the staff.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.



The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 29, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 16.
