### FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- Saturday's contest marks the seventh meeting between Bloomensburg and Mercyhurst but the first since September 19, 2015. The series is even at three wins apiece. The Huskies are 2-2 in Erie against the Lakers with both losses coming two weeks apart in the 2010 season. Mercyhurst handed Bloomensburg a 56-37 loss in the PSAC Championship game on November 13 and then ended the Huskies' season with a 28-14 decision in the second round of the NCAA Division II playoffs.

- Senior Hakeem Sillman leads the conference, and is third in the country, by averaging 216.0 all-purpose yards through the first two weeks of the season. Sillman is also second in the PSAC (15th in the country) in rushing yards per game (123.0) and is second in the conference (20th in the country) in yards per carry (6.65).

- The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomensburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomensburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

- Bloomensburg has scored at least one point in 175 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003. Meanwhile, the Huskies also have a streak of 114 consecutive road games of scoring at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998.

- Getting off the field may be a big factor in the outcome of Saturday's game. The Huskies have limited Merrimack and Edinboro to convert just 8-of-30 (26.7%) third-down opportunities which ranks third in the PSAC and 26th in the country. The Lakers have allowed Hillsdale and Tiffin to convert 21-of-34 (61.8%) of their third downs. Mercyhurst is last in the PSAC through the first two weeks of the season in that department.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**5** - Bloomsburg suffered just its fifth loss (18-5) when forcing three or more turnovers in a game last Saturday against Edinboro. All three turnovers were interceptions (Dexter Jordan 2, Marquis Seamon)

**6** - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era (60 total games). The Huskies are 1-5 in such games

**7** - Number of times that a Bloomsburg team has not forced a turnover in 60 games under Paul Darragh. The Huskies improved to 4-3 in such games with the 28-21 win at Millersville last season

**19** - Bloomsburg's streak of consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years

**34** - The Huskies improved to 34-2 under head coach Paul Darragh when leading at halftime during the season-opening 30-16 victory over Merrimack

**36** - The Huskies improved to 36-3 under head coach Paul Darragh when leading after three quarters during the season-opening 30-16 victory over Merrimack

**49** - Games under head coach Paul Darragh (60 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies were held without a sack once last season

**51** - Bloomsburg is 51-19 against teams from the PSAC Western Division since 1999. The Huskies are 28-7 against teams from the west at Redman Stadium and are 23-12 on the road

**62** - Consecutive road games in which the Huskies had scored more than 10 points. That streak was snapped in the final road game of the season against Shippensburg on November 3

**69** - Bloomsburg is 69-19 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game since 2009

**113** - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 38 contests

**114** - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998

**126** - Consecutive games that Bloomsburg had scored at least one touchdown. That streak was snapped in the final road game of the season against Shippensburg on November 3

**142** - Rushing yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. It was the most rushing yards in an opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013

**175** - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point

**183** - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (183-62, .747). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator

**264** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. His 264 all-purpose were the most in the PSAC in week one and marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005

**300** - The Huskies ran for 300 yards in the win at East Stroudsburg last season. It marked the first time since rushing for 309 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 that Bloomsburg reached 300 rushing yards in a game. The Huskies are now 11-0 under Darragh when hitting that mark

**432** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman through the first two games of the season. That figure leads the PSAC. Sillman is second in the league in rushing (246 yards) and fourth in kickoff returns

**1,000** - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 years

**2,000** - The Huskies have had 13 running backs record at least 2,000 rushing yards in their career. Qmac Quiteh is 804 rushing yards away from becoming the 14th in school history

# NOTES

## LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg trailed 21-7 early in the second quarter and could not quite complete a rally as the Huskies dropped a 21-16 decision to visiting Edinboro University on a rainy Saturday afternoon at Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium. The Huskies had a chance to win the game but had to drive 85 yards over the final 47 seconds of regulation following a key 48-yard punt from Edinboro's Levi Becker that was downed at the Bloomsburg 15-yard line. Erik Benjamin drove the Huskies to the Edinboro 36-yard line after finding Jay Popson on a 17-yard pass play on which Popson got out-of-bounds with two seconds left on the clock. Benjamin had one final chance for a pass into the endzone but he was unable to get the throw off as Ryan Bischof came through the line and sacked Benjamin ending the contest. It was Edinboro's second sack of the drive - the only two sacks allowed by the Huskies during the game and the first two sacks allowed on the young season. Hakeem Sillman led the Huskies with 20 carries for 104 yards on the ground - his second consecutive 100-yard rushing effort. All told, Bloomsburg had 154 yards rushing on the afternoon. Benjamin completed 18-of-36 for 173 yards but was picked off three times. Michael Allen caught a team-high six passes for 55 yards while Popson hauled in five catches for 49 yards. Bloomsburg managed 327 yards of total offense while limiting Edinboro to just 258 yards of offense. Defensively, Nate Monroe led the Huskies with 10 total tackles while Alex Anan had eight stops, two tackles for a loss, and one-and-a-half sacks. Dexter Jordan had two interceptions on the day to go along with six tackles while Marquis Seamon also registered a pick.

Mercyhurst dropped a 24-20 contest to non-conference opponent Tiffin on Saturday at Tullio Field. Garrett Owens scored two touchdowns -- one rushing and one receiving -- to lead the Lakers. He rushed 17 times for 111 yards and also had four receptions for 32 yards. Quarterback Doug Altavilla finished 20-of-29 for 205 yards and one touchdown. Wide receiver Austin Hence had six grabs for 69 yards. On defense, linebacker Alex Zacharyasz was the leading tackler with 11 stops, including one-and-a-half tackles for a loss. Fellow linebacker Corbin Kessler had 10 total tackles, including a half-sack, and two pass breakups. Linebacker Rocky Owens contributed nine tackles, including a sack while defensive back Dante Redwood and linebacker Chris Peluso finished with eight stops each. Redwood broke up two passes. Defensive lineman Xavier Martin added a sack and fellow linemen Matthew Hudson and Jehrod Gregory combined on a sack. Hudson also had a forced fumble.

## LAST MEETING (vs MERCYHURST - September 19, 2015)

Bloomsburg suffered a 20-14 loss to Mercyhurst in front of a large Parents/Family Day crowd at Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium. The Lakers got on the board in the first period when the Huskies Tim Kelly was intercepted by Joe Dever at the Lakers 49-yard line. On the second play of the drive Brendan Boylan hit FJ Williams with a 42-yard scoring pass to give Mercyhurst a 7-0 lead. Bloomsburg went three-and-out on its next series with the Lakers taking over at their own 29-yard line. Boylan completed passes of 14 and 27 yards on consecutive throws to put the Lakers at the Huskies 31-yard line. Runs of 16 and 12 yards followed putting the ball at the Huskies' three yard line where Boylan hit Williams with a three-yard pass for a 14-0 lead. Mercyhurst added to its lead in the second quarter. After a Bloomsburg punt gave the Lakers the ball at their own 20-yard line, Mercyhurst marched down the field in nine plays with Boylan connecting with John Matarazzo on a 19-yard touchdown. The ball was tipped by a Huskies defender, but right into the hands of Matarazzo for the score. However, the extra point was wide leaving the Lakers up 20-0.

The Huskies responded on their first drive of the second half by using a mix of the run and the pass. Lawrence Elliott Jr. started the drive with runs of 11 and seven yards and finished the drive with an 11-yard run and a four-yard touchdown run. A key play on the drive was a 26-yard bootleg run by Kelly on third-and-one that put the ball at the Lakers' 15-yard line. Two series later, the Lakers were pinned back inside their own 10 yard line. On fourth down, a punt from Mercyhurst went just 23 yards with Dexter Jordan returning the ball to the Lakers' 20. Four plays later Joe Parsnik went in from one-yard out to make it 20-14.

The Bloomsburg defense then came up with several big stops in the fourth period forcing the Lakers to punt, but each time the Huskies offense stalled. Bloomsburg's best drive moved the ball to the 15-yard line of Mercyhurst. However, a 34-yard field goal try by Tyler Smith was no good keeping it a six-point game. The Huskies' last drive of the game stalled at the Mercyhurst 49-yard line. The Lakers then ran out the final 3:18 on the clock to post the victory.

Elliott Jr. finished with 25 carries for 100 yards and one score, while Parsnik had 20 carries for 93 yards and a score. Kelly finished 13-of-29 for 107 yards, while defensively Jerrin Toomey had seven tackles and an interception. For Mercyhurst, Boylan was 16-of-35 for 222 yards and three scores and an interception.

## WINNING REPUTATION

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West

Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

### PICK THIS

Senior Dexter Jordan intercepted two Edinboro passes last Saturday, marking the third time in his collegiate career that he recorded a pair of picks in a single game. The two interceptions gave him 10 for his career and tied his season total from a season ago. Jordan has started each of the last 24 games for the Huskies and, with his six tackles against the Fighting Scots, also put him over 100 stops for his career (101). Senior Marquis Seamon registered the other interception for the Huskies on the day - the fifth of his career.

### AMONG THE LEADERS

Senior Hakeem Sillman leads the conference, and is third in the country, by averaging 216.0 all-purpose yards through the first two weeks of the season. Sillman is also second in the PSAC (15th in the country) in rushing yards per game (123.0) and is second in the conference (20th in the country) in yards per carry (6.65). The senior is also fourth in the league in kickoff return average (25.5). Meanwhile, redshirt sophomore Erik Benjamin is third in the PSAC (7th in the country) in rushing touchdowns with four.

On defense, redshirt junior Alex Annan and senior Nate Monroe are seventh and eighth, respectively, in the conference in tackles per game. Annan is averaging 9.5 stops through the first two weeks while Monroe averages 9.0. Redshirt senior Dexter Jordan, with his two picks last Saturday, ranks second in the league (7th in the country) in interceptions per game at 1.0.

### SOLID DEBUTS

Senior Hakeem Sillman, who was making his first appearance in a Bloomsburg uniform, rushed for 142 yards on just 17 carries as Bloomsburg won its season opener. Sillman finished the day with 264 all-purpose yards, adding one catch for 25 yards and three kick returns for 97 yards in the victory. He averaged 8.4 yards per carry and had seven runs of at least 10 yards on the afternoon. His 142 rushing yards were the most by a Bloomsburg player in a season opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013. His 264 all-purpose were the most in the PSAC in week one and marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005. Meanwhile, redshirt sophomore Erik Benjamin made his first collegiate start under center and accounted for three total touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the victory over Merrimack.

### WE'RE BACK

Bloomsburg returns seven of its nine All-Conference performers from last season, including redshirt senior defensive lineman Jake Klinger who earned First Team All-American honors from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Klinger led the Huskies with career-highs in total tackles (69), tackles for a loss (22.0), and quarterback sacks (11.0). His 22 tackles for a loss surpassed Justin Shirk's 21.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage during the 2014 season and is the most by a Bloomsburg player in at least 18 years. Klinger had 18.5 tackles for a loss and 10 sacks over the last seven weeks of the regular season. He recorded at least one tackle in all 11 games, at least one tackle for a loss nine times, and at least one sack on six different occasions.

Klinger had his first sack of the season in the opening victory over Merrimack and added half a sack in the loss to Edinboro last Saturday.

Joining Klinger as returning All-Conference honorees are redshirt senior offensive lineman Travis Krall who, like Klinger, earned a spot on the First Team. Returning Second Team All-PSAC East members include redshirt senior defensive lineman Chris Gary, redshirt senior cornerback Marquis Seamon, redshirt junior running back Alex Gooden, redshirt junior running back Qmac Quiteh, and redshirt junior wide receiver Michael Allen.

### THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE

Sophomore defensive lineman Alexander Findura served in the United States Marine Corps Infantry for four years prior to coming to Bloomsburg. Findura's training and experience led him to become a member of an elite team called the Body Bearers, stationed in Washington D.C. As a part of the Body Bearers, Findura was tasked with aiding in the funerals of fallen soldiers. During his time as a Body Bearer, he had a hand in many funerals including that of General Mundy. While Findura never deployed overseas, he still took a lot away from his experience and was very humbled by the opportunity. "You think you have it bad, but there's a lot worse going on out there, like what I've seen at Arlington Cemetery." Last season, the Huskies had two former Marines on the roster as Findura was joined by redshirt senior Eric Schwartz.

### JAHRI EVANS TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Jahri Evans '07 will be inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame on October 19 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2018. Evans took over as a full-time starter on the Huskies' offensive line in 2003 but it was in 2004 that the awards started rolling in for the left tackle. He was an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior while earning Second Team All-American honors from both the Associated Press and from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Then, as a senior in 2005, Evans helped the Huskies to an average of 284.3 rushing yards per game – eighth-most in the country. He went on to earn First Team All-American honors from five different organizations – the AFCA, Daktronics, Don Hansen Football Gazette, Associated Press, and D2Football.com. He was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, which honors the nation's top lineman in Division II, in each of his last two seasons. He earned both the Danny Litwhiler Award as Bloomsburg's Male Underclass Athlete of the Year in 2005 and the Robert B. Redman Award as Bloomsburg's Male Senior Athlete of the Year in 2006.

Evans was then selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the New Orleans Saints in the 2006 NFL Draft, becoming the first Huskies' player chosen in the draft since 1992. He was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named a First Team All-Pro in four consecutive seasons from 2009-12

while earning Second Team All-Pro accolades in 2013. Evans was also named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team in 2006, was a two-time Madden Most Valuable Protectors Award recipient (2009, 2011), and was a member of the New Orleans Saints' 50th Anniversary Team in 2016. Among Saints' offensive linemen, his six Pro Bowl appearances ranks second all-time in team history. He also ranks second all-time in Saints' history with 169 career games played. He helped the Saints finish in the top six in the league in total offense in all 11 of his seasons (2006-2016), including six number-one rankings. He also helped New Orleans finish in the top ten in scoring in nine of his 11 seasons, including number one rankings in 2008 and 2009. Evans was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned First Team All-Pro recognition for the first time in 2009 – a season that was capped off with the Saints' victory over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Other members of this year's class are Joe Bressi (women's basketball coach), Susan Brophy O'Donnell '81 (women's swimming), Adam Clay '05 (men's soccer), Megan LaBuda '02 (women's basketball), Jen Lefever '96 (softball), and Tom Vargo '66 (wrestling).

### SCOUTING MERCYHURST

Mercyhurst has opened its 2018 season with an 0-2 record after losses to Hillsdale and Tiffin (Ohio). The Lakers are led at quarterback by returning starter, redshirt junior Doug Altavilla who has posted a 60.3% completion percentage and has passed for 345 yards, two touchdowns, and one interception over two games. His best outing came last week against Tiffin, where he completed 20-of-29 passes for 205 yards and one touchdown. Junior Austin Hence leads the team in receiving with eight receptions for 95 yards and one touchdown. On the ground, Mercyhurst uses the combined efforts of redshirt sophomore Garrett Owens and true freshman Fredrick Green. Owens leads the way with 29 carries for 167 yards and one touchdown. He had 111 yards on the ground in the loss to Tiffin on Saturday. Owens is a threat in the passing game as well as he has recorded seven catches for 47 yards and a touchdown. Green, meanwhile, has 22 carries for 79 yards on the season. Junior linebacker Corbin Kessler and redshirt sophomore linebacker Rocky Owens lead the defense with 14 tackles each early in the season. Owens is tied for the team lead in sacks with one on the year. Sophomore defense back Henry Caldwell controls the secondary by leading the team in pass breakups, tallying four over the first two games. The Lakers' defense has also forced five fumbles on the season so far, but have only been able to recover one of them. Sophomore kicker Mark Shafer Jr. has been perfect on the year so far, converting all three of his field goal attempts with a long of 22 yards and his two extra point attempts.

# FROM THE ARCHIVES

Bloomsburg comes into 2018 with 19 consecutive winning seasons, the third-longest streak in PSAC history, and 19 straight years with six or more victories - a PSAC record. The Huskies have not had a losing year after winning the season opener since 1977, only four years since 1938, and just ten in 120 seasons. The four in the past 80 years were: 1956, when they had a 3-4 record after defeating Delaware State; and 1971, 1973, and 1977, when they were 4-5 each season following an opening win over Scranton the first year and Shippensburg the other two.

Bloomsburg's 21-16 loss on Saturday was the fourth contest with that score in the 1,074 games played in school history and the second defeat. The previous three were all played in a span of eight seasons: victories at East Stroudsburg in 1985 and at home with New Haven in 1989, and a loss at Bucknell in 1993. The last one was Danny Hale's first game as head coach of Bloomsburg.

Even with a second half when Edinboro was held scoreless, Saturday's game was the 30th consecutive since 2015 that the Husky defense has surrendered ten or more points - a school record. The previous high was 23 games between 1989 and 1991. The current streak has been more successful: the Huskies went only 7-16 in the 23-game streak from 1989 to 1991 while, in the past 30 games, Bloomsburg is 18-12.

Bloomsburg has an excellent record versus the western division since 1999. Despite Saturday's loss to Edinboro, in the past 19 years, the Huskies are 51-19 against teams from the west, including a road record of 23-13 against Western Division foes.

Saturday's game with Edinboro was Coach Darragh's 60th as head coach, making him just the fifth in school history to coach that many games. His 42 wins tie for the most in the first 60 games with his predecessor, Danny Hale. Hale was 42-17-1 after 60 games (1993-1998) and Darragh is 42-18 since 2013. The record of the other coaches after 60 contests are: Albert Aldinger, 37-20-3 (1894-1903); John Weimer, 32-22-6 (1911-1917, his entire career at Bloomsburg); and Pete Adrian, 31-28-1 (1986-1991).

The all-time record for the Huskies on September 15 is 5-3, with a record of 3-3 at home and 2-0 on the road, since the first game in 1973 with Shippensburg. A win over Scranton in 1972 was the first time a Bloomsburg football team had ever played a game in the first half of September. The only two road games on September 15 were a 34-24 win at Lock Haven in 2001 and a 20-16 victory at Indiana in 2011.

Bloomsburg's series record in six games versus Mercyhurst is 3-3, with a record of 1-1 at home and 2-2 away, since the first game with the Lakers was in 2008. The two losses to Mercyhurst in Erie came in 2010 in the conference championship game and in the NCAA playoffs, the year the Lakers won their only PSAC title.

# A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with a pair of 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

# PAUL DARRAGH

**6th Season (22nd Season at BU)**  
**42-18 Overall Record**  
**Temple '85**



Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 22nd season with the Huskies in 2018 and sixth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2018 campaign with a 41-17 overall record (.707). The 41 victories over his first five seasons marks the most wins in the first five years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .707 winning percentage is the third-best mark during the first five years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 38-4 (.905) from 1947-51 and Danny Hale went 40-14-1 (.736) from 1993-97). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 182-61 (.749).

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Nine Huskies were named All-PSAC East including defensive tackle Jake Klinger, who was an All-Region selection by two different organizations and also a Don Hansen first team All-American.

In 2016, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.

The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 30, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 17.
