FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- Saturday's contest with Shippensburg is the 83rd in the series, with Bloomsburg's record in the first 82 games standing at 36-46 (23-18 at home and 13-28 on the road) since the first game in 1917. The Huskies have an 8-3 record versus the Red Raiders in Redman Stadium since 1994, with the last loss on a rainy Halloween night in 2013. The first win during this period came in 1995. Shippensburg led 31-7 at the half that day, before Bloomsburg stormed back to win 41-34 - still the largest comeback in school history.

- The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

- This season marks the fifth time since the consecutive winning season streak began that the Huskies have started the season with a 1-2 record and, in each case, Bloomsburg went on to win at least seven games. In 2000, the Huskies actually started 0-2 before advancing to the NCAA Division II National Championship game against Delta State where it ultimately fell, 63-34. Bloomsburg also started 1-2 in 2003 (finished 7-4), 2007 (finished 7-3), and 2015 (finished 7-4). Bloomsburg has not started 1-3 since 1998 - the program's last season with an under-.500 record.

- Bloomsburg has scored at least one point in 176 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003. The Huskies have rattled off 88 consecutive home games with at least a point dating back to that loss to the Red Raiders in 2003.

- Bloomsburg comes into the contest ranked third in the PSAC in rushing yards per game (193.0) but goes up against a Shippensburg defense that is fourth in the PSAC in rushing yards allowed per game (102.0). The Huskies are last in the conference in passing yards per game (145.7) but the Red Raiders are last in the conference in passing yardage allowed (305.0).

BY THE NUMBERS

- 0** - In 61 games under Paul Darragh, Bloomsburg has never thrown for at least 300 yards
- 1** - Bloomsburg suffered its first loss under Paul Darragh last Saturday at Mercyhurst when allowing 14 points or fewer in a game. Bloomsburg is now 21-1 in such games
- 3** - Last Saturday's loss at Mercyhurst was just the third time under Paul Darragh that the Huskies lost a game without committing a turnover. Bloomsburg is 10-3 in such games
- 5** - Bloomsburg suffered just its fifth loss (18-5) when forcing three or more turnovers in a game against Edinboro. All three turnovers were interceptions (Dexter Jordan 2, Marquis Seamon)
- 6** - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era (61 total games). The Huskies are 1-5 in such games
- 7** - Number of times that a Bloomsburg team has not forced a turnover in 61 games under Paul Darragh. The Huskies improved to 4-3 in such games with the 28-21 win at Millersville last season
- 19** - Bloomsburg's streak of consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years
- 19** - Number of games under Paul Darragh (61 games) that the Huskies have thrown for at least 200 yards in a game. Bloomsburg has not accomplished that feat yet this season
- 34** - The Huskies improved to 34-2 under Paul Darragh when leading at halftime during the season-opening 30-16 victory over Merrimack. That record dropped to 34-3 last Saturday at Mercyhurst
- 36** - The Huskies improved to 36-3 under Paul Darragh when leading after three quarters during the season-opening 30-16 victory over Merrimack. That record fell to 36-4 last Saturday at Mercyhurst
- 50** - Games under Paul Darragh (61 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies were held without a sack once last season
- 62** - Consecutive road games in which the Huskies had scored more than 10 points. That streak was snapped in the final road game of the season against Shippensburg on November 3
- 69** - Bloomsburg is 69-20 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game since 2009
- 113** - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 39 contests
- 115** - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998
- 126** - Consecutive games that Bloomsburg had scored at least one touchdown. That streak was snapped in the final road game of the season against Shippensburg on November 3
- 142** - Rushing yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. It was the most rushing yards in an opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013
- 176** - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point
- 183** - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (183-63, .744). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator
- 264** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. His 264 all-purpose yards were the most in the PSAC in week one and marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005
- 300** - The Huskies ran for 300 yards in the win at East Stroudsburg last season. It marked the first time since rushing for 309 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 that Bloomsburg reached 300 rushing yards in a game. The Huskies are now 11-0 under Darragh when hitting that mark
- 535** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman through the first three games of the season. That figure is second in the PSAC. Sillman is third in the league in rushing (304 yards) and third in kickoff returns
- 1,000** - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 years

NOTES

LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg suffered its second consecutive loss last Saturday as it fell on the road at Mercyhurst by a 14-10 final. With the Huskies leading 10-7 with 4:33 left in regulation, the Mercyhurst defense forced Bloomsburg to punt from its own 38-yard line. The Lakers' Cortez Watson returned the punt 77 yards before being tackled by Kieron Smethers at the Bloomsburg three-yard line. The Huskies' defense made things interesting as Mercyhurst could not get in on the first three plays setting up a fourth-and-goal from the Huskies' one with the game on the line. Mercyhurst decided to go for the win instead of attempting to tie the game and the move paid off for the Lakers as Doug Altavilla found paydirt from a yard out, despite a bad snap, to give Mercyhurst a 14-10 lead with 2:16 left in regulation after Mark Shafer booted the extra point. On the ensuing possession, Erik Benjamin drove the Huskies down the field thanks, in large part, to a 40-yard pass play to Jay Popson on third-and-eight which set up a first-and-goal from the Mercyhurst nine-yard line. However, Bloomsburg could not get into the endzone with the final attempt being a Benjamin pass attempt, intended for Smethers, being batted down by Mercyhurst's Dante Redwood with 36 seconds left. Neither team was able to generate much in the way of offense as Bloomsburg could muster only 283 yards of total offense while the Lakers had just 245 yards on the afternoon. A majority of the Huskies' yardage came on the ground as Bloomsburg, which entered the contest as the PSAC's top rushing team through the first two weeks, rushed for 164 yards against the Mercyhurst defense. Alex Gooden made a triumphant return to the backfield as he carried the ball 16 times for 99 yards and the lone Bloomsburg touchdown. Hakeem Sillman added 15 carries for 58 yards on the afternoon. Meanwhile, Mercyhurst had most of its yardage through the air as Altavilla threw for 146 yards and one score. Benjamin finished the day by completing 12-of-24 passes for 119 yards but was held to just 66 yards passing until completing a pair of passes for 53 yards on the Huskies' final drive. Popson was the team's leading receiver with four catches for 60 yards. Defensively, Nate Monroe and Alex Annan led the Huskies with six tackles apiece. Chris Gary recorded the lone Bloomsburg sack on the day Marquis Seamon collected his second interception in as many weeks.

Shippensburg could not overcome five turnovers and a strong offensive attack from the opposition last Saturday, as the Red Raiders dropped a 57-14 decision to visiting California (Pa.). Shippensburg (2-1) fell behind 6-0 after the opening possession and trailed 20-0 after the opening quarter. Shippensburg was intercepted five times and yielded 518 yards of offense to the Vulcans, with the only two Red Raider scores coming in the third quarter. Josh Gontarek was the standout performer for the Red Raiders on offense – he finished the day with eight receptions for 109 yards and a touchdown. Gontarek now has a receiving touchdown in all three games this season. Shea O'Donnell had back-to-back receptions of 48 and 27 yards on a third-quarter drive, the second of which resulted in the final Shippensburg touchdown of the day. O'Donnell had three receptions for 70 yards and the score. Brycen Mussina was 19-of-34 for 218 yards, throwing two touchdowns and four interceptions. Senior Chase Yocum also saw time under center, throwing for 11 yards and one interception to go along with eight rushing yards. Raleigh Sirb averaged 4.0 yards per carry on 14 totes. He finished with 56 of Shippensburg's 92 rushing yards on the day. Defensively, Tig Spinelli had a team-high nine tackles, while Steven Cain added seven tackles. John Chaney III had six tackles and intercepted a pass for the second consecutive week.

LAST MEETING (at SHIPPENSBURG - November 4, 2017)

Bloomsburg allowed 20 first-quarter points and could not dig itself out of the hole as the Huskies dropped a 20-6 decision at Shippensburg University. Bloomsburg was limited to just a pair of field goals from Ryan Abbott as the Huskies saw their streak of 125 consecutive games of scoring a touchdown come to an end. The Huskies also saw their string of 62 straight games of reaching double figures in scoring on the road come to a halt.

Things looked promising for the Huskies at the outset as Dexter Jordan picked off Shippensburg quarterback Ryan Zapoticky at the Shippensburg 28-yard line on the very first play from scrimmage. Jordan returned the pick 21 yards to set up a first-and-goal at the seven. However, in a sign of things to come for the Bloomsburg offense, the Huskies managed to gain only three yards on the drive and had to settle for a 21-yard field goal from Abbott with 12:37 left in the opening quarter. Then, the roof caved in as the Red Raiders used three big plays on their next three drives to take a 20-3 advantage.

On the fourth play of Shippensburg's ensuing possession, Zapoticky found a hole and scampered 54 yards for a touchdown and, after Billy Deane added the extra point, the hosts took a 7-3 lead with 11:32 left in the first quarter. Then, on Shippensburg's next drive, Zapoticky launched a deep pass just before getting sacked by Chris Gary and connected with Winston Eubanks on an 83-yard touchdown to extend the Red Raiders' lead to 13-3. Bloomsburg went three-and-out on its next drive and the Zapoticky-to-Eubanks connection hooked up again on Shippensburg's next possession - this time for a 64-yard touchdown - and the Red Raiders took a 20-3 lead with 5:13 left in the opening quarter.

When the dust settled, Shippensburg amassed 244 yards and 20 points in the opening quarter as the Huskies were forced to play catch up. But, unfortunately, for Bloomsburg, the only other points came on a 36-yard field goal from Abbott with 45 seconds left in the first half to cut the Shippensburg lead to 20-6.

NOTES

Bloomsburg's defense settled down immensely after the rough first quarter as the Red Raiders mustered only 149 yards of offense over the final 45 minutes of action. But, the Huskies' offense struggled to mount much pressure against the PSAC's top defense. Bloomsburg finished the day with just 224 yards of total offense and only eight first downs. Shippensburg finished with 393 yards of offense. Alex Gooden led the Huskies on the ground with 64 yards on 12 carries. Chris Palubinsky completed just 11-of-36 passes for 121 yards and three interceptions. Michael Allen caught a team-high four balls for 47 yards. For Shippensburg, Colin McDermott led the ground game with 65 yards on 13 carries. Zapoticky completed 13-of-24 for 236 yards and two scores but was picked off three times. Eubanks caught three passes for 174 yards and both scores.

Other than three plays that totaled 201 yards in the first quarter, the Huskies' defense was superb. The Red Raiders totaled 192 yards on their other 65 plays on the afternoon. Nate Monroe posted a career-high 11 total tackles to lead the way in that department. Alex Annan had a career-high 10 stops while Jake Klinger continued to torment opposing quarterbacks as he finished with a career-high-tying ten tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, and 2.5 sacks. Gary had a pair of sacks and forced two fumbles - one of which he recovered. Jordan had two interceptions while Eric Schwartz had the other. Dennis Robinson led Shippensburg with 13 total tackles. Richard Nase had three sacks.

DON'T COUNT THEM OUT

This season marks the fifth time since the consecutive winning season streak began that the Huskies have started the season with a 1-2 record and, in each case, Bloomsburg went on to win at least seven games. In 2000, the Huskies actually started 0-2 before advancing to the NCAA Division II National Championship game against Delta State where it ultimately fell, 63-34. Bloomsburg also started 1-2 in 2003 (finished 7-4), 2007 (finished 7-3), and 2015 (finished 7-4). Bloomsburg has not started 1-3 since 1998 - the program's last season with an under-.500 record.

WINNING REPUTATION

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

PICK THIS

Senior Dexter Jordan intercepted two Edinboro passes in the loss to the Fighting Scots on September 8, marking the third time in his collegiate career that he recorded a pair of picks in a single game. The two interceptions gave him 10 for his career and tied his season total from a season ago. Jordan has started each of the last 25 games for the Huskies and, with his six tackles against the Fighting Scots, also put him over 100 stops for his career (101).

AMONG THE LEADERS

Senior Hakeem Sillman is second in the conference, and is ninth in the country, by averaging 178.3 all-purpose yards through the first three weeks of the season. Sillman is also second in the PSAC (34th in the country) in rushing yards per game (101.3). Meanwhile, redshirt sophomore Erik Benjamin is sixth in the PSAC (19th in the country) in rushing touchdowns with four. On defense, senior Marquis Seamon is tied for the PSAC lead (tied for 23rd in the country) in passes defended per game at 1.7. He has two interceptions and five pass breakups through the first three games of the season.

SOLID DEBUTS

Senior Hakeem Sillman, who was making his first appearance in a Bloomsburg uniform, rushed for 142 yards on just 17 carries as Bloomsburg won its season opener. Sillman finished the day with 264 all-purpose yards, adding one catch for 25 yards and three kick returns for 97 yards in the victory. He averaged 8.4 yards per carry and had seven runs of at least 10 yards on the afternoon. His 142 rushing yards were the most by a Bloomsburg player in a season opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013. His 264 all-purpose were the most in the PSAC in week one and marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005. Meanwhile, redshirt sophomore Erik Benjamin made his first collegiate start under center and accounted for three total touchdowns (two rushing, one passing) in the victory over Merrimack.

WE'RE BACK

Bloomsburg returns seven of its nine All-Conference performers from last season, including redshirt senior defensive lineman Jake Klinger who earned First Team All-American honors from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Klinger led the Huskies with career-highs in total tackles (69), tackles for a loss (22.0), and quarterback sacks (11.0). His 22 tackles for a loss surpassed Justin Shirk's 21.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage during the 2014 season and is the most by a Bloomsburg player in at least 18 years. Klinger had 18.5 tackles for a loss and 10 sacks over the last seven weeks of the regular season. He recorded at least one tackle in all 11 games, at least one tackle for a loss nine times, and at least one sack on six different occasions.

PRESEASON POLL

JAHRI EVANS TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Jahri Evans '07 will be inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame on October 19 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2018. Evans took over as a full-time starter on the Huskies' offensive line in 2003 but it was in 2004 that the awards started rolling in for the left tackle. He was an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior while earning Second Team All-American honors from both the Associated Press and from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Then, as a senior in 2005, Evans helped the Huskies to an average of 284.3 rushing yards per game – eighth-most in the country. He went on to earn First Team All-American honors from five different organizations – the AFCA, Daktronics, Don Hansen Football Gazette, Associated Press, and D2Football.com. He was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, which honors the nation's top lineman in Division II, in each of his last two seasons. He earned both the Danny Litwhiler Award as Bloomsburg's Male Underclass Athlete of the Year in 2005 and the Robert B. Redman Award as Bloomsburg's Male Senior Athlete of the Year in 2006. Evans was then selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the New Orleans Saints in the 2006

NFL Draft, becoming the first Huskies' player chosen in the draft since 1992. He was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named a First Team All-Pro in four consecutive seasons from 2009-12 while earning Second Team All-Pro accolades in 2013. Evans was also named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team in 2006, was a two-time Madden Most Valuable Protectors Award recipient (2009, 2011), and was a member of the New Orleans Saints' 50th Anniversary Team in 2016. Among Saints' offensive linemen, his six Pro Bowl appearances ranks second all-time in team history. He also ranks second all-time in Saints' history with 169 career games played. He helped the Saints finish in the top six in the league in total offense in all 11 of his seasons (2006-2016), including six number-one rankings. He also helped New Orleans finish in the top ten in scoring in nine of his 11 seasons, including number one rankings in 2008 and 2009. Evans was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned First Team All-Pro recognition for the first time in 2009 – a season that was capped off with the Saints' victory over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Other members of this year's class are Joe Bressi (women's basketball coach), Susan Brophy O'Donnell '81 (women's swimming), Adam Clay '05 (men's soccer), Megan LaBuda '02 (women's basketball), Jen Lefever '96 (softball), and Tom Vargo '66 (wrestling).

SCOUTING SHIPPENSBURG

The Red Raiders come into this contest with a 2-1 record after suffering their first loss of the season against California (Pa.) last weekend, 57-14. Turnovers haunted Shippensburg as the Vulcans forced five to kill any chance of a Red Raider win. Quarterback Brycen Mussina went 19-of-34 for 218 yards and four interceptions while Raleigh Sirb led the team in rushing with 56 yards on 14 carries. Josh Gontarek was Mussina's favorite target as he ended the game with eight receptions for 109 yards and a touchdown. Shea O'Donnell caught the other touchdown pass and finished with three catches for 70 yards. Tig Spinelli lead the defense with nine tackles while Josh Lister recorded the teams' only sack. John Chaney III recorded the team's only interception. Mussina has started all three games at quarterback and has completed 54.7% of his passes while throwing for 851 yards, eight touchdowns, and six interceptions. Shippensburg has used the combined efforts of Sirb and Marcus Lominy to spearhead the rushing attack. Both Sirb (29 carries) and Lominy (32 carries) have 147 yards each on the ground. Winston Eubanks leads the team in receiving yards with 226 on 11 catches. Gontarek has tallied 223 yards on a team-high 13 catches, scoring three touchdowns. On the defensive side of the ball, the Red Raider secondary has tallied five interceptions on the season with Chaney III leading with two. Steven Cain leads the team in tackles with 27 while Lister and Dakota Thompson are tied for the team lead in sacks with three each. The Red Raiders have not made a field goal all season with both David Shank and Jeremias Medici missing their only attempts on the year.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

The Huskies' record in 44 seasons at Redman Stadium, since the first game in 1974, is 157-75-4. The 3-3 record in 2017 was the first non-winning season at home since 1999. The last losing record was 2-3 in 1993.

Bloomsburg comes into 2018 with 19 consecutive winning seasons, the third-longest streak in PSAC history, and 19 straight years with six or more victories - a PSAC record. The Huskies have not had a losing year after winning the season opener since 1977, only four years since 1938, and just ten in 120 seasons. The four in the past 80 years were: 1956, when they had a 3-4 record after defeating Delaware State; and 1971, 1973, and 1977, when they were 4-5 each season following an opening win over Scranton the first year and Shippensburg the other two.

The Huskies are 1-2 to start a season for the first time since 2015. That year, they rebounded to finish 7-4. The last time they began a season 1-2 with a win in the opener was in 2007—a victory over C.W. Post followed by losses to California and Edinboro. They finished that season with a mark of 7-3. A Bloomsburg team has not started a season 1-3 since 1998.

After scoring 30 points in the opener, Bloomsburg has scored 16 and then 10 points in the next two games. The last time a Husky team has had decreasing point totals for the first three games in a season was in 1969. That year, they scored 25, 21, and then 14 in losses to Lock Haven, Mansfield, and Adelphi.

The 14-10 defeat on Saturday at Mercyhurst was only the third contest with that score in the 1,075 games played in school history—all losses—and the first in 84 years. The last time it occurred was at East Stroudsburg in 1934 and the first time in 1926 at Williamsport versus the Dickinson Seminary, now Lycoming College.

Saturday's loss was the 30th consecutive, since 2015, that the Husky defense has surrendered ten or more points - extending a school record. The previous high was 23 games between 1989 and 1991. The current streak has been more successful: the Huskies went only 7-16 in the 23-game streak from 1989 to 1991 while, in the past 30 games, Bloomsburg is 18-12.

The all-time record for the Huskies on September 22 is 6-4, with a record of 2-3 at home and 4-1 on the road. The most recent game on this date was a 42-27 win at L.I.U. Post in 2012. The last game at home was 28 years ago in 1990 - a 33-6 loss to Edinboro, and last home win 23-13 over East Stroudsburg in 1984. The first game in school history played on September 22 was in 1951, a 20-7 victory against Mansfield on Berwick's Crispin Field. The Huskies played five games on Crispin Field from 1948 to 1951, all wins.

Saturday's contest with Shippensburg is the 83rd in the series, with Bloomsburg's record in the first 82 games standing at 36-46 (23-18 at home and 13-28 on the road) since the first game in 1917. The Huskies have an 8-3 record versus the Red Raiders in Redman Stadium since 1994, with the last loss on a rainy Halloween night in 2013. The first win during this period came in 1995. Shippensburg led 31-7 at the half that day, before Bloomsburg stormed back to win 41-34 - still the largest comeback in school history.

A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with a pair of 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 22nd season with the Huskies in 2018 and sixth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2018 campaign with a 41-17 overall record (.707). The 41 victories over his first five seasons marks the most wins in the first five years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .707 winning percentage is the third-best mark during the first five years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 38-4 (.905) from 1947-51 and Danny Hale went 40-14-1 (.736) from 1993-97). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 182-61 (.749).

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Nine Huskies were named All-PSAC East including defensive tackle Jake Klinger, who was an All-Region selection by two different organizations and also a Don Hansen first team All-American.

In 2016, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.

The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 30, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 17.
