FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- Saturday's game with East Stroudsburg is the 90th in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting 111 years ago in 1907. Bloomsburg has a 43-44-2 record in the series, with a mark of 22-22-1 at home, 21-20-1 on the road, and 0-2 at a neutral site. The Huskies have a record of 21-4 with the Warriors since 1994, including 10-3 at home and 11-1 at East Stroudsburg.

- The Huskies closed out the 2017 campaign with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

- The Huskies are 2-4 through six games for the first time since the 1998 season - the last year that the Huskies finished below .500. The last start worse than this year's was 1-5 in 1993, the first season for former head coach Danny Hale. In game seven that year, Hale started freshman quarterback, and future BU Hall-of-Famer, Glen McNamee, who for the rest of his career led the Huskies to a record of 31-7-1.

- Bloomsburg has scored at least one point in 179 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003. The Huskies have rattled off 90 consecutive home games with at least a point dating back to that loss to the Red Raiders in 2003.

- The matchup to watch is Bloomsburg's offense against East Stroudsburg's defense. The Huskies enter with the worst offense in the PSAC (280.3 yards per game) while the Warriors' defense is dead last in the conference in yards allowed per game (533.8). Bloomsburg has had back-to-back games with under 200 yards of total offense and has only surpassed 400 yards in a game once this season (403 against Merrimack). East Stroudsburg, meanwhile, has allowed fewer than 500 yards only once this season (379 vs Millersville).

BY THE NUMBERS

- 0** - In 64 games under Paul Darragh, Bloomsburg has never thrown for at least 300 yards
- 1** - Bloomsburg suffered its first loss under Paul Darragh at Mercyhurst (9/15/18) when allowing 14 points or fewer in a game. Bloomsburg is now 21-1 in such games
- 2** - Bloomsburg dropped to 1-2 this season when not turning the ball over after the loss at Kutztown. The Huskies entered the season with a 10-2 mark under Paul Darragh when not committing a turnover
- 3** - Touchdowns thrown by Erik Benjamin in the victory over Shippensburg. He became the first player to throw for at least three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly against West Chester on November 30, 2013
- 5** - Bloomsburg allowed five sacks in the loss at Kutztown marking the first time since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009 that the Huskies allowed five sacks in a game. Bloomsburg has allowed nine sacks in the last two weeks
- 5** - Bloomsburg suffered just its fifth loss (18-5) when forcing three or more turnovers in a game against Edinboro (9/8/18). All three turnovers were picks (Dexter Jordan 2, Marquis Seamon)
- 8** - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era (64 total games). The Huskies are 1-7 in such games and have not reached 100 yards rushing in back-to-back weeks
- 19** - Bloomsburg's streak of consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years
- 19** - Number of games under Paul Darragh (64 games) that the Huskies have thrown for at least 200 yards. Bloomsburg has not accomplished that feat yet this season
- 52** - Games under Paul Darragh (64 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies did not register a sack in the loss at Kutztown
- 70** - Bloomsburg is 70-20 when rushing for more than 100 yards in a game since 2009
- 113** - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 42 contests
- 116** - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998
- 142** - Rushing yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. It was the most rushing yards in an opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013
- 179** - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point
- 184** - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (184-65, .739). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator
- 200** - The Huskies have not reached 200 yards of total offense in back-to-back weeks - the first time since prior to the 1999 season. Bloomsburg had 196 yards at Kutztown and then 165 yards against West Chester
- 250** - Saturday's game is the 250th game with Paul Darragh on the coaching staff (65th as head coach)
- 264** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. His 264 all-purpose were the most in the PSAC in week one and marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005
- 300** - The Huskies ran for 300 yards in the win at East Stroudsburg last season. It marked the first time since rushing for 309 yards against Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 that Bloomsburg reached 300 rushing yards in a game. The Huskies are now 11-0 under Darragh when hitting that mark
- 668** - Number of rushing yards needed by Qmac Quiteh to become the 14th player in school history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career
- 1,000** - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 years

NOTES

LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg allowed 14 unanswered points in the second half and suffered its second consecutive loss with a 17-14 setback to 13th-ranked West Chester last Saturday in front of more than 5,800 fans at Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium for Homecoming Weekend. Bloomsburg held a 14-3 lead at halftime but the Golden Rams rallied in the second half on an 11-yard touchdown run from Mark Dukes on the opening drive of the third quarter followed by a 26-yard touchdown reception by Elijah Hall from A.J. Long early in the fourth quarter to take a 17-14 advantage. On the Huskies' ensuing possession, Bloomsburg drove down the field but stalled at the West Chester 20-yard line. Jaco Sattamini came on to attempt a game-tying 37-yard field goal with 5:36 left in regulation but the kick was blocked by West Chester's Tyler Morrissey to keep the Golden Rams in front by three. For the second consecutive week, Bloomsburg could not eclipse 200 yards of total offense as it was held to a season-low 165 yards by a Golden Rams' defense that was ranked ninth in the country in yards allowed per game. The Huskies ran just 50 offensive plays and converted only nine first downs on the afternoon as West Chester played keep away by winning the time of possession battle by holding the ball for more than 36 minutes. West Chester ran 72 plays and totaled 330 yards of offense. Bloomsburg finished the day with 54 yards on the ground against the nation's top rushing defense. Alex Gooden totaled 55 yards on eight carries while Qmac Quiteh added 25 yards on six totes. Benjamin, however, was sacked four times for a loss of 38 yards which brought the team's rushing total down significantly. He finished 12-of-26 for 111 yards, one touchdown, and one interception. Marshall Rizzuto and Jay Popson each caught three passes while Michael Allen hauled in the touchdown pass - an 11-yard strike early in the second quarter. The Huskies' defense did a good job containing Long who came in with 1,250 passing yards and 360 rushing yards while totaling 19 touchdowns through the first five games of the season. Long finished 16-of-23 for 184 yards and one score but was picked off twice. He added 40 yards rushing on 23 carries with his average coming down due to a season-high five Bloomsburg sacks. Dexter Jordan accounted for the other Huskies' score with an 18-yard interception return late in the first half. It was his second career pick-six with his first coming in a 35-14 win over East Stroudsburg on October 22, 2016. Defensively, Kasean Patterson, Alex Annan, and sophomore Alexander Findura each finished with ten total tackles. It marked career bests for both Patterson and Findura and was one short of a career-high for Annan. Findura also led the way with three tackles for a loss and one and-a-half sacks.

Ben Moser's 38-yard hail mary touchdown pass to Anthony Guarino, on fourth-and-20 with 45 seconds left, brought East Stroudsburg within two points of 23rd-ranked Kutztown, but the conversion was no good and the Golden Bears recovered the ensuing onside kick to hold on for a 35-33 win Saturday night at Eiler-Martin Stadium. Kutztown led 21-0 midway through the second quarter before the Warriors rallied, cutting it to 21-13 at halftime on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Moser to R.J. Sarajian and a 72-yard blocked field goal return for a touchdown by Jamal Cooley with 16 seconds left in the half. Kutztown led 28-13 entering the fourth quarter but had to hang on for dear life and needed a recovery by Ryan Hubley on the onside kick to hang on. Moser finished 27-for-37 for 286 yards, three scores, and an interception, playing in relief of redshirt freshman Jake Cirillo (5-for-13, 42 yards), who made his first career start last week at Millersville after Moser opened the first four games. Jaymar Anderson had 19 carries for 117 yards, his ninth 100-yard game in 16 career starts and his third in five games this year. Guarino had four catches for 105 yards and the late touchdown while Sarajian had three catches for 71 yards and a score. Jylil Reeder had two for 48 yards and a the other receiving touchdown. Collin DiGalbo had 384 yards total offense for Kutztown, going 26-for-39 for 344 yards and four TD and running for 40 yards. Joel Ozoemena was credited with East Stroudsburg's blocked field goal, which Cooley returned for the 72-yard score after a lateral from Joseph Odebo - the Warriors' fourth touchdown following a blocked field goal in 468 games under head coach Denny Douds. Kutztown finished with 547 yards on 78 plays, gaining 344 passing and 203 rushing. East Stroudsburg had 455 yards on 69 plays - 328 passing and 127 rushing.

LAST MEETING (at EAST STROUDSBURG - October 21, 2017)

Bloomsburg scored 28 unanswered points, after falling behind 28-10 early in the third quarter, to come from behind and stun East Stroudsburg, 38-28, at Eiler-Martin Stadium. The win clinched a 19th consecutive winning season for Bloomsburg dating back to a 5-6 record during the 1998 campaign.

Bloomsburg outgained East Stroudsburg, 455-271, and held the ball for nearly 38 minutes on offense. However, the Warriors stayed in the game thanks, in large part, to four Bloomsburg turnovers - three in the first half - which led to a 21-10 halftime lead for the hosts. Then, after East Stroudsburg's Rich Melito picked up a Bloomsburg fumble - the Huskies' fourth turnover of the afternoon - and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown, Bloomsburg found itself trailing 28-10 with 13:44 left in the third quarter.

But, the Huskies responded on the ensuing drive with a 15-play, 66-yard march that took 8:34 off the clock and was capped off by Qmac Quiteh's one-yard touchdown run to pull Bloomsburg to within 28-17 with 5:02 left in the third quarter. After the Warriors went three-and-out on their next possession, the Huskies put together another lengthy scoring drive - 87 yards in 10 plays with 5:38 coming off the clock - with Chris Palubinsky finding paydirt from a yard out. The Huskies went for two but Quiteh was stopped short of the goal line and Bloomsburg trailed, 28-23, with 13:22 left in regulation.

On the hosts' next possession, the Bloomsburg's defense stiffened again and Marquez Norford sacked Warrior quarterback Ben Moser causing a fumble at the East Stroudsburg 24-yard line. Jake Klinger fell on the loose ball and the Huskies were in business again. Two plays later, Palubinsky found Michael Allen on a 23-yard reception and, after Alex Gooden scored on the two-point conversion, the Huskies led 31-28 with 10:45 remaining. Later in the fourth, the Huskies essentially put the game on ice when Nate Monroe, sacked Moser forcing another fumble. Eric Schwartz recovered and

ran it back 15 yards for a touchdown to give the Huskies a 38-28 advantage with 4:46 left.

Bloomsburg rushed for a season-high 300 yards on the day, averaging 6.1 yards on 49 carries. It marked the most rushing yards in a game by the Huskies since running for 309 yards in a double-overtime victory over Lock Haven on November 7, 2015 and the team improved to 11-0 under head coach Paul Darragh when rushing for at least 300 yards in a game. Quiteh established a new career-high with 168 yards and two scores on 24 carries. Gooden also got over the century mark with 108 yards on 19 carries. The duo became the first pair of Bloomsburg backs to rush for more than 100 yards in the same game since Eddie Mateo (269) and Dai'Shon Munger (143) accomplished the feat in a 41-10 win over then-#7 West Chester on October 25, 2014.

On the flip side, the Huskies' defense limited East Stroudsburg to just four yards rushing on 19 carries - the fewest rushing yards allowed by a Bloomsburg team in a game since limiting Kutztown to minus-3 yards on the ground in a 31-12 win over the Golden Bears on September 21, 2013.

DiGiorgio played the first half and was very effective for the Warriors under center. The southpaw was 13-of-20 for 202 yards and three scores in the opening thirty minutes but did not play a single down in the second half. Moser came on in relief and was not nearly as effective, going 5-of-15 for 65 yards. In fact, after accumulating 216 total yards in the first half, East Stroudsburg was limited to just 55 total yards in the second half as the Huskies made their comeback. Palubinsky struggled early but then got in a groove when he was needed most. He finished the day 13-of-23 for 155 yards and one touchdown. He started the game 2-of-8 for ten yards and one interception before going 11-of-15 for 145 yards and one score from late in the second quarter on. Allen caught four passes for 51 yards and the touchdown while Jay Popson also hauled in four passes for 48 yards.

Defensively, Klinger was a force to be reckoned with all afternoon. He finished the day with a career-high three sacks, three tackles for a loss, and the fumble recovery that led to Bloomsburg's go-ahead touchdown with 10:45 left in regulation. He also broke up a pass. The Huskies finished with six sacks on the day - three from Klinger, and one each from Monroe, Norford, and Chris Gary. Sekou Jones led East Stroudsburg with a dozen tackles on the day.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

The Huskies were held to a season-low 165 yards of total offense in last week's 17-14 loss to West Chester. It marks the first time the Huskies have not reached 200 yards of total offense in consecutive weeks since prior to the 1999 season. Bloomsburg has also not rushed for at least 100 yards in back-to-back games over the same time period.

Two weeks ago, the Huskies suffered a 44-10 loss at Kutztown - the team's worst loss since a 58-20 loss at Shippensburg in the opening round of the NCAA Division II playoffs on November 17, 2012. Bloomsburg, meanwhile, allowed Kutztown to sack redshirt sophomore quarterback Erik Benjamin five times in the game - the first time a Bloomsburg team allowed five or more sacks in a game since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009.

Against Shippensburg, Benjamin threw for just 109 yards against Shippensburg but became the first Huskies' quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly accomplished the feat against West Chester on November 30, 2013. Meanwhile, on the flip side, Shippensburg's Brycen Mussina threw for four scores against the Bloomsburg defense to become the first opposing quarterback to throw for that many touchdowns in a game since West Chester's Sean McCartney threw for four on November 9, 2013.

BREAKING OUT

Two Huskies - sophomores Kasean Patterson and Alexander Findura - had notable breakout performances last Saturday against West Chester. Patterson had a career-high ten tackles and picked off his first collegiate pass while, the former Marine Findura also posted career-highs in tackles (10), tackles for a loss (3.0), and sacks (1.5) in the loss. Patterson entered the game with 22 career tackles in his first 14 games while Findura entered the game with 12 tackles, two tackles for a loss, and one sack in his first 14 collegiate contests.

SALAK EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Redshirt senior Josh Salak was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in the win over Shippensburg. It marked the first weekly conference honor of Salak's collegiate career.

Salak played a huge role defensively as the Huskies opened divisional play with a 28-24 home win over the Red Raiders. Salak finished with a career-high seven tackles (five solo) while also picking off his first career pass and recovering his first career fumble as the Huskies snapped a two-game losing skid and evened their overall record at 2-2 on the season. Salak's fumble recovery came midway through the third quarter, with the Huskies leading 14-12, and led to a Bloomsburg touchdown which, at the time, extended the lead to 21-12. On Shippensburg's next drive, Salak intercepted his first career pass at the Bloomsburg 35 to end a potential Red Raider scoring opportunity.

DYNAMIC DUO

Senior Dexter Jordan intercepted two Edinboro passes in the loss to the Fighting Scots on September 8, marking the third time in his collegiate career that he recorded a pair of picks in a single game. The two interceptions gave him 10 for his career. Last Saturday, Jordan returned an interception 18 yards for a touchdown against West Chester - the second pick-six of his career. His partner at cornerback, senior Marquis Seamon, is second in the PSAC and ranks seventh in the country in passes

defended per game (1.8). Seamon has three interceptions and eight pass breakups through six games this season. He picked off his third pass of the season at Kutztown - the only turnover of the game for either team.

WINNING REPUTATION

The Huskies closed out 2017 with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years.

PRESEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record (4-3 in the East) - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. The Huskies finished fourth in the Eastern Division last year and have not finished worse than fourth in the division since 1992 when they went 2-8 overall and 1-5 in divisional play.

JAHRI EVANS TO BE INDUCTED INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Jahri Evans '07 will be inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame on October 19 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2018. Evans took over as a full-time starter on the Huskies' offensive line in 2003 but it was in 2004 that the awards started rolling in for the left tackle. He was an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior while earning Second Team All-American honors from both the Associated Press and from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Then, as a senior in 2005, Evans helped the Huskies to an average of 284.3 rushing yards per game - eighth-most in the country. He went on to earn First Team All-American honors from five different organizations - the AFCA, Daktronics, Don Hansen Football Gazette, Associated Press, and D2Football.com. He was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, which honors the nation's top lineman in Division II, in each of his last two seasons. He earned both the Danny Litwhiler Award as Bloomsburg's Male Underclass Athlete of the Year in 2005 and the Robert B. Redman Award as Bloomsburg's Male Senior Athlete of the Year in 2006. Evans was then selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the New Orleans Saints in the 2006

NFL Draft, becoming the first Huskies' player chosen in the draft since 1992. He was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named a First Team All-Pro in four consecutive seasons from 2009-12 while earning Second Team All-Pro accolades in 2013. Evans was also named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team in 2006, was a two-time Madden Most Valuable Protectors Award recipient (2009, 2011), and was a member of the New Orleans Saints' 50th Anniversary Team in 2016. Among Saints' offensive linemen, his six Pro Bowl appearances ranks second all-time in team history. He also ranks second all-time in Saints' history with 169 career games played. He helped the Saints finish in the top six in the league in total offense in all 11 of his seasons (2006-2016), including six number-one rankings. He also helped New Orleans finish in the top ten in scoring in nine of his 11 seasons, including number one rankings in 2008 and 2009. Evans was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned First Team All-Pro recognition for the first time in 2009 - a season that was capped off with the Saints' victory over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Other members of this year's class are Joe Bressi (women's basketball coach), Susan Brophy O'Donnell '81 (women's swimming), Adam Clay '05 (men's soccer), Megan LaBuda '02 (women's basketball), Jen Lefever '96 (softball), and Tom Vargo '66 (wrestling).

SCOUTING EAST STROUDSBURG

The Warriors are currently on a three-game losing streak but have remained competitive with all three losses coming by less than three points. Last week against Kutztown, ESU rallied back from a 21-13 halftime deficit and scored on a 38-yard hail mary touchdown pass with only 45 seconds remaining in the game. The two-point conversion was no-good and the Golden Bears recovered the ensuing onside kick to kill any chance of a last-second Warriors comeback, 35-33. Quarterback Ben Moser, playing in relief of Jake Cirillo, finished 27-for-37 for 286 yards, three touchdowns and an interception while running back Jaymar Anderson had 19 carries for 117 yards. Anderson had his ninth 100-yard game in 16 career starts and his third in five games this year. Anthony Guarino led the team with four catches for 105 yards and scored the last second touchdown. Billy Inge III led in tackles with 10 while Joel Ozoemena was credited with a blocked field goal that Jamal Cooley returned for a 72-yard touchdown.

Moser has started four games for the Warriors and has gone 76-156 for 1169 yards, eight touchdowns and 10 interceptions. Moser is fifth in the conference in passing yards per game (233.8). Anderson leads in rushing and has 122 carries for 637 yards and eight touchdowns. He is tops in the PSAC in rushing yards per game (127.4) and is tied for fourth in the league in rushing touchdowns. Jylil Reeder is tops of the receiving corps with 27 catches for 529 yards and five touchdowns. He is fifth in the league in receiving yards per game (88.2). Guarino and R.J. Sarajian have also caught three touchdown passes apiece. On defense, Joshua Taylor leads the team with 43 tackles (32 solo, 11 assisted) and also has an interception. Inge (23 solo, 15 assisted) and Cooley (27 solo, 11 assisted) are tied for second on 38 tackles. Inge also leads the team in interceptions with two.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

The Huskies' record in 44 seasons at Redman Stadium, since the first game in 1974, is 158-76-4. The 3-3 record in 2017 was the first non-winning season at home since 1999. The last losing record was 2-3 in 1993.

Saturday's loss was the 33rd consecutive game, since 2015, that the Huskies' defense has surrendered ten or more points - extending a school record. The previous high was 23 games between 1989 and 1991. The current streak has been more successful: the Huskies went only 7-16 in the 23-game streak from 1989 to 1991 while, in the past 33 games, Bloomsburg is 19-14.

Bloomsburg had an 11-point lead at the half in Saturday's loss to West Chester. This was only the sixth time in 136 home games since the 1923 season (the earliest year scoring records by quarter are complete) that the Huskies led by ten or more at the half and lost. Their record in such home games is now 130-6 and, including road contests since 1923, is 218-8. Since Redman Stadium opened in 1974 their record is 83-5—two of those five losses coming in the last six home games—and the only defeat with a greater lead at the half was in 1989, when Bloomsburg led Cheney 21-0 and lost 31-28.

The Huskies have lost three consecutive Homecomings for the first time since 1980-82, when their overall record was 2-25-1. They have not lost four straight since a school record six in a row from 1972-1977. They have also lost four of their last seven games at Redman Stadium, the worst stretch since seven straight losses from 1992-1993.

Bloomsburg has started the 2018 season with four losses in six games, matching an identical record 20 years ago in 1998, the last losing season for the program. The last start worse than this year's was 1-5 in 1993, the first season for former head coach Danny Hale. In game seven that year, Hale started freshman quarterback and future BU Hall-of-Famer Glen McNamee, who for the rest of his career led the Huskies to a record of 31-7-1.

The 17-14 final on Saturday was the first time the Huskies have lost a contest by that score in the 1,078 games played in school history. The only one close was a 17-15 defeat at Lock Haven in 2003. They have won twice by a 17-14 count: at East Stroudsburg in 1989 and at home to Seton Hill in 2015, the winning points coming on a last second field goal.

Bloomsburg's all-time record on October 13 in 12 games since 1917 is 6-6, with a record of 4-4 at home and 2-2 on the road. The last three on this date have all come against East Stroudsburg: a 23-21 home loss in 1990, a 34-7 road win in 2001, and a 48-27 Homecoming victory in 2012.

Today's game with East Stroudsburg is the 90th in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting 111 years ago in 1907. Bloomsburg has a 43-44-2 record in the series, with a mark of 22-22-1 at home, 21-20-1 on the road, and 0-2 at a neutral site. The Huskies have a record of 21-4 with the Warriors since 1994, including 10-3 at home and 11-1 at East Stroudsburg.

A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with a pair of 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 22nd season with the Huskies in 2018 and sixth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2018 campaign with a 41-17 overall record (.707). The 41 victories over his first five seasons marks the most wins in the first five years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .707 winning percentage is the third-best mark during the first five years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 38-4 (.905) from 1947-51 and Danny Hale went 40-14-1 (.736) from 1993-97). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 182-61 (.749).

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Nine Huskies were named All-PSAC East including defensive tackle Jake Klinger, who was an All-Region selection by two different organizations and also a Don Hansen first team All-American.

In 2016, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.

The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 30, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 17.
