FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- The game with Millersville is the 81st in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting in 1916. Bloomsburg has an overall record of 45-30-5 versus the Marauders, with a mark of 26-11-4 at home and 19-19-1 on the road. The series has had three distinct eras: Bloomsburg posting a record of 20-9-4 up through 1970, Millersville a record of 21-7-1 from 1971-99, and the Huskies winning the past 18 beginning in 2000.

- The Huskies closed out the 2017 campaign with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Bloomsburg needs two wins in its last three games to keep the streak intact.

- Chris Gary recorded half a sack on Saturday at Lock Haven to give him 25.5 career sacks with the Huskies. He is half a sack shy of tying Larry Webster's school record of 26 he set from 2012-13. Entering the season, Webster was seventh in conference history with his 26 sacks. Millersville is last in the country in sacks allowed as it has given up 48 sacks in eight games.

- Bloomsburg has scored at least one point in 181 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003. The Huskies have rattled off 91 consecutive home games with at least a point dating back to that loss to the Red Raiders.

- The Marauders are excellent in forcing opponent turnovers as they have caused 20 miscues through eight games this season - fifth-most in the country. However, Bloomsburg is good at not turning the ball over as the Huskies have committed only nine turnovers all season with four of those coming in the loss to Edinboro. The Huskies have turned the ball over just three times over the last six games.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 0** - In 66 games under Paul Darragh, Bloomsburg has never thrown for at least 300 yards
- 1** - Sacks needed by Chris Gary to become the program's all-time career sack leader. He trails Larry Webster's (2012-13) current record of 26 by half a sack
- 1** - Bloomsburg suffered its first loss under Paul Darragh at Mercyhurst (9/15/18) when allowing 14 points or fewer in a game. Bloomsburg is now 21-1 in such games
- 1** - Number of completions by Erik Benjamin in the win over East Stroudsburg. It was a big one, though - a 31-yard touchdown strike to Michael Allen that gave the Huskies the lead for good
- 2** - Bloomsburg dropped to 1-2 this season when not turning the ball over after the loss at Kutztown. The Huskies entered the season with a 10-2 mark under Paul Darragh when not committing a turnover
- 3** - Touchdowns thrown by Erik Benjamin in the victory over Shippensburg which was equaled last Saturday at Lock Haven. He became the first player to throw for at least three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly against West Chester on November 30, 2013
- 5** - Bloomsburg allowed five sacks in the loss at Kutztown marking the first time since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009 that the Huskies allowed five sacks in a game
- 5** - Bloomsburg suffered just its fifth loss (20-5) when forcing three or more turnovers in a game against Edinboro (9/8/18). All three turnovers were picks (Dexter Jordan 2, Marquis Seamon)
- 8** - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era (66 total games). The Huskies are 1-7 in such games
- 9** - Passing attempts in the win over East Stroudsburg - the fewest since attempting six passes in a 24-17 win against California (Pa.) on September 6, 2008
- 19** - Bloomsburg's streak of consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years
- 20** - Number of games under Paul Darragh (66 games) that the Huskies have thrown for at least 200 yards. Bloomsburg did it for the first time this season last Saturday at Lock Haven (233)
- 54** - Games under Paul Darragh (66 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies did not register a sack in the loss at Kutztown
- 57** - Passing yards by the Huskies in the win over East Stroudsburg - the fewest in a game since throwing for 13 yards in a 24-7 win at Stonehill on September 6, 2014
- 100** - Bloomsburg had three players rush for more than 100 yards against East Stroudsburg (10/13/18) - Qmac Quiteh (123), Hakeem Sillman (117), and Alex Gooden (112). It was the first time Bloomsburg had three 100-yard rushers in a game since October 9, 2004 in a 37-12 win over Kutztown (Jamar Brittingham (142), Mike Ceroli (109), and Julius Brown (101))
- 113** - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 44 contests
- 117** - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998
- 142** - Rushing yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. It was the most rushing yards in an opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013
- 181** - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point
- 186** - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (186-65, .741). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator
- 264** - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. His 264 all-purpose yards marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005
- 355** - Bloomsburg rushed for a season-high 355 yards in the win over East Stroudsburg - the most yards on the ground by a Huskies' team since running for 454 yards against West Chester in a 41-10 victory on October 25, 2014
- 541** - Number of rushing yards needed by Qmac Quiteh to become the 14th player in school history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career
- 1,000** - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 years

Erik Benjamin threw for a career-high 190 yards and tied a career-high with three touchdown passes as Bloomsburg took care of Lock Haven, 33-7, on Saturday afternoon at Hubert Jack Stadium. Kieron Smethers also added his first career touchdown pass on a fake punt to give the Huskies four touchdown throws on the afternoon - the first time since a 56-10 win over Lock Haven on September 28, 2013, that Bloomsburg had four touchdown passes in a game. Bloomsburg had its best offensive showing of the season on Saturday as it posted season-highs in points (33), total offensive yards (470), and passing yards (233) in the victory. Meanwhile, the defense limited the Bald Eagles to just 246 yards of total offense and only 10 first downs all afternoon. The Huskies also held a significant edge in the time of possession battle as they held the ball for more than 37 minutes - including nearly 12 minutes in the third quarter alone. Alex Gooden led the Huskies' ground game with 94 yards on only 11 carries. Hakeem Sillman added 64 yards on 17 carries while Jack Gaugler posted 25 yards on three totes. Okay Osameka made his first collegiate appearance on the final drive in the fourth quarter and finished with 36 yards on only four carries. In an unusual Bloomsburg football performance, all four touchdowns scored by the Huskies on Saturday were through the air. Benjamin finished 16-of-23 for 190 yards and three scores. Michael Allen caught five passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns while Marshall Rizzuto had four catches for 42 yards and his first career touchdown. Josh Salak was on the receiving end of Smethers' 43-yard touchdown throw on a fake punt early in the third quarter to account for the other score. Defensively, Marquis Seamon led the Huskies with seven tackles (all solo) and one tackle for a loss. Chris Gary also had seven total tackles (one solo), two tackles for a loss, and half a sack. Salak and Nathaniel Webb added five stops apiece. Jake Klinger had one-and-a-half tackles for a loss and one-and-a-half sacks.

Millersville scored a season-high 34 points last Saturday and threw for more than 300 yards for the second time on the year but suffered a 38-34 non-conference loss against Malone. The Marauders, playing without four defensive starters, allowed a season-high 511 yards of total offense. Millersville scored 17 unanswered points between the third and fourth quarters before Malone reclaimed the lead with 3:23 left. The Marauders drove to the Malone two-yard line on the final drive but could not get into the endzone on four consecutive plays. Collin Shank finished the game 26-of-41 for 266 yards and three touchdowns. Joey Farley led the team in receiving and finished with 132 yards and two touchdown grabs. Malik Diggs and Nolan Kilpatrick reached double digits in tackles with 15 and 12, respectively. Jhet Janis and Brendan Sherman each hauled in an interception.

LAST MEETING (at MILLERSVILLE - September 30, 2017)

Alex Gooden rushed for a career-high 164 yards and Jordan Villafane broke up a potential game-tying touchdown pass on Millersville's last play from scrimmage as Bloomsburg held off the Marauders of Millersville, 28-21, at Chryst Field at Biemesderfer Stadium.

Facing a fourth-and-14 from its own 28 yard line, Millersville was forced to go for it with less than a minute remaining and only one timeout left. Quarterback Tony Staffieri, who accounted for three touchdowns on the afternoon, went deep looking for his top receiver, Kevin Wiggins. The wideout appeared to have a couple of steps on the Huskies' defense but Villafane leapt and got his fingertips on the pass to knock it away and prevent a potential game-tying touchdown in the closing seconds. From there, the Huskies took a pair of knees and escaped with the seven-point victory over a much-improved Marauders' team.

Bloomsburg ran for 269 yards and four scores in the win. Gooden broke out in a big way, carrying the ball a career-high 18 times for a career-best 164 yards and his second rushing touchdown of the season. He averaged 9.1 yards per carry and had four attempts of at least 10 yards including a career-long 53-yard scamper late in the second quarter. Qmac Quiteh added 82 yards on 18 carries while Tre Green had only one carry but it was a big one - a 33-yard burst up the middle for the Huskies' third touchdown of the contest. It was Green's first collegiate score.

Bloomsburg amassed a season-high 477 yards of total offense - 269 on the ground and 208 through the air - while limiting Millersville to only 249 total yards on the afternoon. The three-headed monster of Gooden, Quiteh, and Green accounted for 279 yards rushing on 37 carries while the rest of the team had minus-eight yards rushing on 11 carries. Chris Palubinsky was efficient throwing the football as he completed 12-of-19 passes for 208 yards. Michael Allen had team-highs in catches (5) and receiving yards (87) while Jay Popson added three catches for 34 yards.

Staffieri completed 18-of-32 for 168 yards and two touchdowns and also led the Marauders with 44 yards rushing on 12 carries. Nii Kotei Nikoi had a team-high four catches while Wiggins had a team-best 43 yards receiving.

Defensively, Jake Klinger had a huge day for the Huskies as he finished with seven total tackles, a career-high five tackles for a loss, and a career-best one-and-a-half sacks. Eric Schwartz also had seven total stops. Cameron Boykin and Tommy Holloway led Millersville with a dozen stops apiece.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

Qmac Quiteh, Hakeem Sillman, and Alex Gooden each got over the century mark on the ground in the Huskies' win over East Stroudsburg. Quiteh led the Huskies with 123 yards on 14 carries but was followed closely by Sillman, who finished with 117 yards on 15 attempts, and Gooden, who carried the ball 17 times for 112 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the first time that Bloomsburg had three players rush for at least 100 yards in a game since Jamar Brittingham (142), Mike Ceroli (109), and Julius Brown (101) accomplished the feat in a 37-12 victory at Kutztown on October 9, 2004. The Huskies ran for 355 yards on 60 attempts - the most rushing yards in a game since rushing for 454

yards in a 41-10 victory over West Chester on October 25, 2014.

Against West Chester, the Huskies were held to a season-low 165 yards of total offense in the 17-14 loss to West Chester. It marked the first time the Huskies had not reached 200 yards of total offense in consecutive weeks since prior to the 1999 season. Bloomsburg had also not rushed for at least 100 yards in back-to-back games over the same time period.

The Huskies suffered a 44-10 loss at Kutztown - the team's worst loss since a 58-20 loss at Shippensburg in the opening round of the NCAA Division II playoffs on November 17, 2012. Bloomsburg, meanwhile, allowed Kutztown to sack Erik Benjamin five times in the game - the first time a Bloomsburg team allowed five or more sacks in a game since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009.

Against Shippensburg, Benjamin threw for just 109 yards against Shippensburg but became the first Huskies' quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly accomplished the feat against West Chester on November 30, 2013. Meanwhile, on the flip side, Shippensburg's Brycen Mussina threw for four scores against the Bloomsburg defense to become the first opposing quarterback to throw for that many touchdowns in a game since West Chester's Sean McCartney threw for four on November 9, 2013.

The Huskies will honor 11 seniors prior to the opening kickoff on Saturday - Chris Dunford, Chris Gary, Dexter Jordan, Jake Klinger, Travis Krall, Nate Monroe, Blake Remensnyder, Josh Salak, Marquis Seamon, Hakeem Sillman, and Josh Tripp.

FAKING YOU OUT

Junior Kieron Smethers has worked a fake punt to perfection in back-to-back weeks in a pair of big plays that helped the Huskies to back-to-back victories. Two weeks ago, with Bloomsburg trailing 10-0 early in the third quarter, Smethers scampered for a four-yard run on fourth-and-one from the Bloomsburg 35-yard line to keep a drive alive. The Huskies went on to score their first points of the game on the drive and went on to knock off East Stroudsburg, 26-18. Then, last Saturday, Smethers was again brought out to punt but threw a 43-yard touchdown pass to senior Josh Salak to extend Bloomsburg's lead to 26-0 early in the third at Lock Haven. The Huskies went on to win, 33-7.

SWEEPING THE AWARDS

Redshirt junior Alex Gooden was named the PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week, redshirt freshman Tyshaun Pollard earned PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors, and junior Kieron Smethers grabbed PSAC East Special Teams Player of the Week accolades for their efforts in the win over East Stroudsburg. It marked the first weekly honors for all three.

Gooden ran for a season-high 112 yards on 17 carries (6.6 yards per carry) and scored a pair of touchdowns. Four of his 17 carries went for at least 10 yards with three more accounting for nine yards. He scored on runs of two yards and seven yards in the second half as the Huskies rallied from a 10-point deficit at halftime. The touchdowns were his second and third of the season and sixth and seventh of his career.

Pollard intercepted the first two passes of his collegiate career with both of his picks coming in the second half and leading to Huskies' touchdowns. His first interception came at the ESU 45-yard line and led to a touchdown pass from Erik Benjamin to Michael Allen which gave the Huskies their first lead at 13-10 with 5:54 left in the third quarter. Then, with the Warriors driving, Pollard came up with his second interception at the Huskies' one-yard line to keep Bloomsburg ahead 19-10 with 6:35 left in regulation. That led to another Huskies' score which gave Bloomsburg a 26-10 advantage with just over three minutes left. Pollard also finished with four total tackles on the day (two solo, two assisted).

Smethers, meanwhile, didn't have the longest play of the day but it single-handedly altered the outcome. On the opening drive of the third quarter, with the Huskies trailing 10-0, Bloomsburg went nine yards on three plays to set up fourth-and-one from the Huskies' 35-yard line. Smethers was brought out to punt but ran for the first down marker and got four yards to keep the drive alive. Six plays later, the Huskies were in the endzone for the first time on the day, cutting the ESU lead to 10-7 with 9:34 left in the third. Smethers did punt four times in the game with two of those punts pinning the Warriors inside their own 20 yard line.

SALAK EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Redshirt senior Josh Salak was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in the win over Shippensburg. It marked the first weekly conference honor of Salak's collegiate career.

Salak played a huge role defensively as the Huskies opened divisional play with a 28-24 home win over the Red Raiders. Salak finished with a career-high seven tackles (five solo) while also picking off his first career pass and recovering his first career fumble as the Huskies snapped a two-game losing skid and evened their overall record at 2-2 on the season. Salak's fumble recovery came midway through the third quarter, with the Huskies leading 14-12, and led to a Bloomsburg touchdown which, at the time, extended the lead to 21-12. On Shippensburg's next drive, Salak intercepted his first career pass at the Bloomsburg 35 to end a potential Red Raider scoring opportunity.

DYNAMIC DUO

Senior Dexter Jordan intercepted two Edinboro passes in the loss to the Fighting Scots on September 8, marking the third time in his collegiate career that he recorded a pair of picks in a single game. The two interceptions gave him 10 for his career. Jordan then returned an interception 18 yards for a touchdown against West Chester - the second pick-six of his career. Two weeks ago, Jordan intercepted his fourth pass of the year - tied for fourth-most in the PSAC. His partner at cornerback, senior Marquis Seamon, is fourth in the PSAC and ranks 20th in the country in passes defended per game (1.50). Seamon has three interceptions and nine pass breakups through eight games this season.

WINNING REPUTATION

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record (4-3 in the East) - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. The Huskies need to win two of their last three games to keep the streak alive.

PRESEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record (4-3 in the East) - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. The Huskies finished fourth in the Eastern Division last year and have not finished worse than fourth in the division since 1992 when they went 2-8 overall and 1-5 in divisional play.

JAHRI EVANS INDUCTED INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Jahri Evans '07 was inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame on October 19 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2018. Evans took over as a full-time starter on the Huskies' offensive line in 2003 but it was in 2004 that the awards started rolling in for the left tackle. He was an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior while earning Second Team All-American honors from both the Associated Press and from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Then, as a senior in 2005, Evans helped the Huskies to an

average of 284.3 rushing yards per game - eighth-most in the country. He went on to earn First Team All-American honors from five different organizations - the AFCA, Daktronics, Don Hansen Football Gazette, Associated Press, and D2Football.com. He was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, which honors the nation's top lineman in Division II, in each of his last two seasons. He earned both the Danny Litwhiler Award as Bloomsburg's Male Underclass Athlete of the Year in 2005 and the Robert B. Redman Award as Bloomsburg's Male Senior Athlete of the Year in 2006. Evans was then selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the New Orleans Saints in the 2006 NFL Draft, becoming the first Huskies' player chosen in the draft since 1992. He was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named a First Team All-Pro in four consecutive seasons from 2009-12 while earning Second Team All-Pro accolades in 2013. Evans was also named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team in 2006, was a two-time Madden Most Valuable Protectors Award recipient (2009, 2011), and was a member of the New Orleans Saints' 50th Anniversary Team in 2016. Among Saints' offensive linemen, his six Pro Bowl appearances ranks second all-time in team history. He also ranks second all-time in Saints' history with 169 career games played. He helped the Saints finish in the top six in the league in total offense in all 11 of his seasons (2006-2016), including six number-one rankings. He also helped New Orleans finish in the top ten in scoring in nine of his 11 seasons, including number one rankings in 2008 and 2009. Evans was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned First Team All-Pro recognition for the first time in 2009 - a season that was capped off with the Saints' victory over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV. Other members of this year's class were Joe Bressi (women's basketball coach), Susan Brophy O'Donnell '81 (women's swimming), Adam Clay '05 (men's soccer), Megan LaBuda '02 (women's basketball), Jen Lefever '96 (softball), and Tom Vargo '66 (wrestling).

SCOUTING MILLERSVILLE

The Marauders enter Saturday's matchup with a 2-6 record overall and a 2-2 mark in the PSAC East. In its last game against Malone, Millersville gained the lead early in the fourth quarter but then gave up a late touchdown to fall to Malone, 34-31. Collin Shank finished the game 26-of-41 for 266 yards and three touchdowns. Joey Farley led the team in receiving and finished with 132 yards and two touchdown grabs. Malik Diggs and Nolan Kilpatrick reached double digits in tackles with 15 and 12, respectively. Jhet Janis and Brendan Sherman each hauled in an interception. Millersville has been outscored, 216-78, on the season and rank last in the PSAC in yards per game (286.1). The bright spot for the Marauders this season has been their tremendous pass defense as they give up only 188.4 yards per game which ranks them first in the conference. They also rank fifth in interceptions with 13 on the year. Shank has seen the majority of reps at quarterback this season and has completed 58.4% of his passes for 1,039 yards, three touchdowns and nine interceptions. Tony Staffieri leads the team in rushing with 202 yards from 47 carries. Chris Dolan is the leading receiver with 33 catches for 422 yards and two touchdowns. Trejon Dinkins is the leading tackler with 69 stops on the year. Ray Lopez leads the secondary in interceptions with four while Marcel Mingo has contributed three interceptions of his own.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

The Huskies' record in 44 seasons at Redman Stadium, since the first game in 1974, is 159-76-4. The 3-3 record in 2017 was the first non-winning season at home since 1999. The last losing record was 2-3 in 1993.

Bloomsburg led by 19 points at the half in Saturday's victory over Lock Haven. The only previous 19-point lead in a road game since 1923—also by a count of 19-0—was at Lock Haven in 1987. The Huskies went on to win that day 25-6. Having a lead of that size in a road game means the outcome is fairly certain. Through 2017, Bloomsburg's record in road games with a 15-point lead or more was 53-0 and 88-2 when ahead by at least 10 points.

The Huskies led by a count of 33-0 after three quarters. Only twice before have they led by 33 after three on the road: at Cheyney in 2001 in a 46-0 rout and at Fairmont State in 2005, a game that ended 33-0. There have been only 15 games since 1923 where Bloomsburg had a bigger lead at the end of three quarters and its record away from home when leading by at least ten points after three is now 115-2.

Bloomsburg has a record of 4-4 after eight games. This is only the sixth time since the schedule went to nine games in 1971 that this has occurred. In the previous five seasons, the ninth game was played with East Stroudsburg. Losses at home to the Warriors resulted in 4-5 final season records in 1971, 1973, and 1977. In 1983, a home loss to East Stroudsburg and a win in the final game gave the Huskies a 5-5 record. Only in 1999 did the Huskies defeat East Stroudsburg, this time on the road. They went on to win the next two and end the year with a four-game winning streak and a winning record of 7-4.

The 33-7 final on Saturday was the first time the Huskies have won a contest by that score in the 1,080 games played in school history. It marked the seventh time the team has scored 33 points in a game since the first in 1922, a 33-10 victory over Shippensburg. The closest Bloomsburg previously came to this score was a 33-6 win at Mansfield in 1957. Their only loss by a score of 33-7 took place at Scranton in 1952.

Bloomsburg's all-time record on October 27 in 16 games since 1894 is 9-7, with a record of 4-3 at home and 5-4 on the road. The last home game on this date was a 16-14 Homecoming victory over Mansfield in 1990. The only game with Millersville on October 27 took place there in 2001, a 42-13 Husky victory.

Saturday's game with Millersville is the 81st in the series between the two schools, dating back to the first meeting 102 years ago in 1916. Bloomsburg has an overall record of 45-30-5 versus the Marauders, with a mark of 26-11-4 at home and 19-19-1 on the road. The series has had three distinct eras: Bloomsburg posting a record of 20-9-4 up through 1970, Millersville a record of 21-7-1 from 1971-99, and the Huskies winning the past 18 beginning in 2000.

A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with a pair of 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 22nd season with the Huskies in 2018 and sixth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2018 campaign with a 41-17 overall record (.707). The 41 victories over his first five seasons marks the most wins in the first five years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .707 winning percentage is the third-best mark during the first five years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 38-4 (.905) from 1947-51 and Danny Hale went 40-14-1 (.736) from 1993-97). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 182-61 (.749).

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Nine Huskies were named All-PSAC East including defensive tackle Jake Klinger, who was an All-Region selection by two different organizations and also a Don Hansen first team All-American.

In 2016, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.

The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 30, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 17.
