FIVE THINGS TO WATCH

- Saturday's game with West Liberty is Bloomsburg's first with that institution, but the fourth in school history versus a team from West Virginia. The previous three have all been on the road: a 33-0 win over Fairmont State in 2005, 24-21 over Shepherd in 2006, and a 32-26 loss to Concord in 2014, the last two in the NCAA playoffs. The all-time record for the Huskies in 82 games versus out-of-state teams is 45-35-2, with a mark of 26-11-1 at home and 19-24-1 on the road.

- The Huskies closed out the 2017 campaign with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Bloomsburg needs one win in its last two games to keep the streak intact.

- Chris Gary recorded two sacks on Saturday against Millersville to become the school's all-time leader in career sacks with 27.5. He broke Larry Webster's school record of 26 he set from from 2012-13. Entering the season, Webster was seventh in conference history with his 26 sacks.

- Bloomsburg has scored at least one point in 182 consecutive games dating back to a 21-0 home loss against Shippensburg on September 13, 2003. The Huskies have rattled off 117 consecutive road games with at least a point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998.

- The Huskies are coming off of an eight-sack performance against Millersville last week and now faces a West Liberty team that is 160th out of 167 teams in the country in sacks allowed per game (3.89). After totaling just six sacks in the first five games, Bloomsburg has 21 sacks in the last four contests and is now 18th in the country in sacks per game (3.00).

BY THE NUMBERS

-8 - Rushing yards allowed by the Huskies in last week's victory over Millersville. It was just the second time since the 1997 season that a Bloomsburg team held an opponent to negative yards on the ground
0 - In 67 games under Paul Darragh, Bloomsburg has never thrown for at least 300 yards

1 - Bloomsburg suffered its first loss under Paul Darragh at Mercyhurst when allowing 14 points or fewer in a game. Bloomsburg is now 21-1 in such games

1 - Number of completions by Erik Benjamin in the win over East Stroudsburg. It was a big one, though - a 31-yard touchdown strike to Michael Allen that gave the Huskies the lead for good

2 - Bloomsburg dropped to 1-2 this season when not turning the ball over after the loss at Kutztown. The Huskies entered the season with a 10-2 mark under Paul Darragh when not committing a turnover
3 - Touchdowns thrown by Erik Benjamin in the victory over Shippensburg which was equaled at Lock Haven. He became the first player to throw for at least three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly against West Chester on November 30, 2013

5 - Bloomsburg allowed five sacks in the loss at Kutztown marking the first time since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009 that the Huskies allowed five sacks in a game

5 - Bloomsburg suffered just its fifth loss (21-5) when forcing three or more turnovers in a game against Edinboro (9/8/18). All three turnovers were picks (Dexter Jordan 2, Marquis Seamon)

8 - Times that Bloomsburg has been held under 100 yards rushing in a game during the Paul Darragh era (67 total games). The Huskies are 1-7 in such games

8 - Sacks by Bloomsburg in last Saturday's win over Millersville - most since recording eight, also against Millersville, on October 1, 2016

9 - Passing attempts in the win over East Stroudsburg - the fewest since attempting six passes in a 24-17 win against California (Pa.) on September 6, 2008

19 - Bloomsburg's streak of consecutive winning seasons. The Huskies have not had a losing season since going 5-6 in 1998. Bloomsburg has a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years

20 - Number of games under Paul Darragh (67 games) that the Huskies have thrown for at least 200 yards. Bloomsburg did it for the first time this season at Lock Haven (233)

27.5 - With his two sacks last Saturday against Millersville, Chris Gary broke the school-record for most career sacks with 27.5. Larry Webster (2012-13) held the previous record with 26

55 - Games under Paul Darragh (67 total) that the Huskies' defense has recorded at least one sack. The Huskies did not register a sack in the loss at Kutztown

57 - Passing yards by the Huskies in the win over East Stroudsburg - the fewest in a game since throwing for 13 yards in a 24-7 win at Stonehill on September 6, 2014

100 - Bloomsburg had three players rush for more than 100 yards against East Stroudsburg - Qmac Quiteh (123), Hakeem Sillman (117), and Alex Gooden (112). It was the first time Bloomsburg had three 100-yard rushers in a game since October 9, 2004 in a 37-12 win over Kutztown (Jamar Brittingham (142), Mike Ceroli (109), and Julius Brown (101))

113 - Bloomsburg is 113-3 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game. However, the Huskies have reached the 40-point plateau only four times in the last 45 contests

117 - Consecutive road games that Bloomsburg has scored at least one point dating back to a 30-0 loss at Millersville on October 10, 1998

142 - Rushing yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. It was the most rushing yards in an opener since Franklyn Quiteh rushed for 182 yards against Stonehill on September 7, 2013

182 - Consecutive games of scoring at least one point

187 - Bloomsburg victories with Paul Darragh on the staff (187-65, .742). Darragh joined the Huskies' staff in 1997 as the defensive coordinator

264 - All-purpose yards by Hakeem Sillman in the season-opening victory over Merrimack. His 264 all-purpose yards marked the most by a Husky in a season opener since Jamar Brittingham totaled 283 all-purpose yards against Slippery Rock on August 27, 2005

355 - Bloomsburg rushed for a season-high 355 yards in the win over East Stroudsburg - the most yards on the ground by a Huskies' team since running for 454 yards against West Chester in a 41-10 victory on October 25, 2014

520 - Number of rushing yards needed by Qmac Quiteh to become the 14th player in school history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career

1,000 - Bloomsburg has had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 years

LAST WEEK

Bloomsburg recorded eight sacks, forced four turnovers, and held Millersville to minus-8 rushing yards as the Huskies won their third straight game by taking care of the Marauders, 38-14, on a cold and rainy Saturday at Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium in the final home game of the 2018 season. It marked just the second time since the 1997 season that a Bloomsburg team held an opponent to negative rushing yards in a game with the only other occurrence during the last 21 years coming on September 21, 2013 when the Huskies held Kutztown to minus-3 yards on the ground in a 31-12 victory over the Golden Bears. Chris Gary recorded two of Bloomsburg's eight sacks on the day and, in the process, became the school's all-time career sack leader. Jake Klinger and AJ Simon also recorded two sacks each while Nahzir Wilson and Tom Pellegrino had single sacks on the afternoon. Klinger's two sacks were part of a monster afternoon as he led the Huskies with seven total tackles, four-and-a-half tackles for a loss, two sacks, and a fumble recovery in the victory. The eight sacks were the most since recording eight, also against Millersville, back on October 1, 2016. All told, the Huskies held a 337-209 edge in total offense. Bloomsburg finished with 230 yards on the ground - the third consecutive game with at least 200 rushing yards - and added 107 yards through the air. Alex Gooden led the ground game with 16 carries for 88 yards and one touchdown while Sillman chipped in with 65 yards on 15 totes. Erik Benjamin completed 8-of-18 for 107 yards and one touchdown. Michael Allen caught three passes for 42 yards to lead the receiving corps. Bloomsburg was able to score 17 of its 38 points off of Millersville turnovers. Klinger had the lone Huskies' fumble recovery while Nate Monroe, Marquis Seamon, and Tyshaun Pollard had interceptions with Monroe's being a pick-six on the second play from scrimmage. The defense also finished with 12 tackles for a loss and seven pass breakups - three by Logan Yohn. In addition to the season-high eight sacks, the Huskies also were credited with nine quarterback pressures - three by Gary - as the line was in the Millersville backfield all afternoon.

Concord forced four West Liberty turnovers and scored a pair of special teams touchdowns to hand the Hilltoppers a 46-33 setback Saturday afternoon. West Liberty battled back from an early 16-point deficit to grab a brief lead in the opening minute of the second half but the Mountain Lions responded with 21 unanswered points to put the game out of reach. The loss overshadowed a sterling performance by Zach Phillips, who racked up more than 400 yards of total offense. The junior quarterback completed 29-of-48 passes for a career-high 398 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for 39 yards and another score. Nate Phillips, a true freshman, also impressed with six catches for 96 yards and two touchdowns while senior wide receiver Shane Phillips added 84 yards on six catches. D.J. Frisby ran for 90 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries to go along with two catches for 81 yards - including a 69-yard touchdown in the second quarter. The Hilltoppers finished with a season-high 510 yards of total offense to 408 for Concord, ran 84 plays to just 51 for the Mountain Lions and had a 25-16 advantage in first downs. Zach Phillips' 437 yards of total offense were the most by a West Liberty player since Dakota Conwell had 489 yards of total offense in a 59-51 loss to Notre Dame on October 22, 2015. His 398 passing yards were the most by a Hilltopper quarterback since Conwell threw for 435 yards against West Virginia State on November 12, 2016.

SCOUTING WEST LIBERTY

West Liberty comes into the game with a 3-6 overall record with this being its only non-conference game of the season. The Hilltoppers are 3-1 at West Family Stadium including a 36-24 win over West Virginia State two weeks ago. Last Saturday, West Liberty dropped a 46-33 decision at Concord to fall to 0-5 on the road. The Hilltoppers are led by quarterback Zach Phillips who was at Gannon previously. He has completed 51.3% of his passes for 1,084 yards and nine touchdowns with only three interceptions. Phillips is also second on the team in rushing with 326 yards and four scores. Senior running back Charles Westbrook leads West Liberty in rushing this season with 525 yards and four touchdowns on 137 attempts. Sophomore Ridge Durbin and senior Shane Phillips find themselves atop the team in receiving as Durbin has caught 36 passes for 256 yards and two touchdowns. Phillips has had 28 receptions for 322 yards and two scores. Defensively, the Hilltoppers are led by senior Clifford Clark, who has recorded 106 total tackles (65 solo) in nine games this season. He is tied for the conference lead and is tied for fourth in the country in tackles per game (11.8). Clark also leads the team in sacks (3.0) and tackles for a loss (8.5). Junior Logan Deri is second with 62 total tackles while also recording one sack and 5.5 tackles for a loss. Joshua Ojo is an interception machine in the secondary as he leads with seven while also breaking up seven other passes.

SACK MASTER

Senior Chris Gary recorded two sacks on Saturday to give him 27.5 for his career and the school record for most career sacks. He broke Larry Webster's (2012-13) previous record of 26.0. Gary is up to a team-leading seven sacks this season and has recorded 26.5 of his sacks over the last three seasons. His career-high was 12.5 set during the 2016 season when he was named a Don Hansen Second Team All-American.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

Bloomsburg allowed minus-8 yards rushing to Millersville last Saturday, the fewest yards rushing allowed in a game since allowing minus-16 yards on the ground against Mansfield in a 74-13 victory on October 12, 1996. Meanwhile, the Huskies' eight sacks against the Marauders were the most by a Bloomsburg team since recording eight, also against Millersville, back on October 1, 2016.

Qmac Quiteh, Hakeem Sillman, and Alex Gooden each got over the century mark on the ground in the Huskies' win over East Stroudsburg. Quiteh led the Huskies with 123 yards on 14 carries but was

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followed closely by Sillman, who finished with 117 yards on 15 attempts, and Gooden, who carried the ball 17 times for 112 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the first time that Bloomsburg had three players rush for at least 100 yards in a game since Jamar Brittingham (142), Mike Ceroli (109), and Julius Brown (101) accomplished the feat in a 37-12 victory at Kutztown on October 9, 2004. The Huskies ran for 355 yards on 60 attempts - the most rushing yards in a game since rushing for 454 yards in a 41-10 victory over West Chester on October 25, 2014.

Against West Chester, the Huskies were held to a season-low 165 yards of total offense in the 17-14 loss to West Chester. It marked the first time the Huskies had not reached 200 yards of total offense in consecutive weeks since prior to the 1999 season. Bloomsburg had also not rushed for at least 100 yards in back-to-back games over the same time period.

The Huskies suffered a 44-10 loss at Kutztown - the team's worst loss since a 58-20 loss at Shippensburg in the opening round of the NCAA Division II playoffs on November 17, 2012. Bloomsburg, meanwhile, allowed Kutztown to sack Erik Benjamin five times in the game - the first time a Bloomsburg team allowed five or more sacks in a game since a 17-10 win at California on September 5, 2009.

Against Shippensburg, Benjamin threw for just 109 yards against Shippensburg but became the first Huskies' quarterback to throw for three touchdowns in a game since Tim Kelly accomplished the feat against West Chester on November 30, 2013. Meanwhile, on the flip side, Shippensburg's Brycen Mussina threw for four scores against the Bloomsburg defense to become the first opposing quarterback to throw for that many touchdowns in a game since West Chester's Sean McCartney threw for four on November 9, 2013.

KLINGER EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Senior Jake Klinger earned the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week award for his efforts in the win over Millersville. It was his first weekly honor of the season and second of his career. Klinger had his biggest game of the season as he finished with seven total tackles, 4.5 tackles for a loss, two sacks, and a fumble recovery as the Huskies won their third consecutive contest, 38-14, over the Marauders, on a rainy afternoon at Danny Hale Field at Redman Stadium. It was his first fumble recovery of the season while the other three categories were all season-highs. He led the Huskies in total tackles and tackles for a loss and tied for the team lead with Chris Gary and AJ Simon in sacks as Bloomsburg racked up a season-high eight sacks on the day.

FAKING YOU OUT

Junior Kieron Smethers worked a fake punt to perfection in back-to-back weeks in a pair of big plays that helped the Huskies to back-to-back victories. Three weeks ago, with Bloomsburg trailing 10-0 early in the third quarter, Smethers scampered for a four-yard run on fourth-and-one from the Bloomsburg 35-yard line to keep a drive alive. The Huskies went on to score their first points of the game on the drive and went on to knock off East Stroudsburg, 26-18. Then, two weeks ago, Smethers was again brought out to punt but threw a 43-yard touchdown pass to senior Josh Salak to extend Bloomsburg's lead to 26-0 early in the third at Lock Haven. The Huskies went on to win, 33-7.

SWEEPING THE AWARDS

Redshirt junior Alex Gooden was named the PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week, redshirt freshman Tyshaun Pollard earned PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors, and junior Kieron Smethers grabbed PSAC East Special Teams Player of the Week accolades for their efforts in the win over East Stroudsburg. It marked the first weekly honors for all three.

Gooden ran for a season-high 112 yards on 17 carries (6.6 yards per carry) and scored a pair of touchdowns. Four of his 17 carries went for at least 10 yards with three more accounting for nine yards. He scored on runs of two yards and seven yards in the second half as the Huskies rallied from a 10-point deficit at halftime. The touchdowns were his second and third of the season and sixth and seventh of his career.

Pollard intercepted the first two passes of his collegiate career with both of his picks coming in the second half and leading to Huskies' touchdowns. His first interception came at the ESU 45-yard line and led to a touchdown pass from Erik Benjamin to Michael Allen which gave the Huskies their first lead at 13-10 with 5:54 left in the third quarter. Then, with the Warriors driving, Pollard came up with his second interception at the Huskies' one-yard line to keep Bloomsburg ahead 19-10 with 6:35 left in regulation. That led to another Huskies' score which gave Bloomsburg a 26-10 advantage with just over three minutes left. Pollard also finished with four total tackles on the day (two solo, two assisted).

Smethers, meanwhile, didn't have the longest play of the day but it single-handedly altered the outcome. On the opening drive of the third quarter, with the Huskies trailing 10-0, Bloomsburg went nine yards on three plays to set up fourth-and-one from the Huskies' 35-yard line. Smethers was brought out to punt but ran for the first down marker and got four yards to keep the drive alive. Six plays later, the Huskies were in the endzone for the first time on the day, cutting the ESU lead to 10-7 with 9:34 left in the third. Smethers did punt four times in the game with two of those punts pinning the Warriors inside their own 20 yard line.

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SALAK EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Redshirt senior Josh Salak was named the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in the win over Shippensburg. It marked the first weekly conference honor of Salak's collegiate career. Salak played a huge role defensively as the Huskies opened divisional play with a 28-24 home win over the Red Raiders. Salak finished with a career-high seven tackles (five solo) while also picking off his first career pass and recovering his first career fumble as the Huskies snapped a two-game losing skid and evened their overall record at 2-2 on the season. Salak's fumble recovery came midway through the third quarter, with the Huskies leading 14-12, and led to a Bloomsburg touchdown which, at the time, extended the lead to 21-12. On Shippensburg's next drive, Salak intercepted his first career pass at the Bloomsburg 35 to end a potential Red Raider scoring opportunity.

DYNAMIC DUO

Senior Dexter Jordan intercepted two Edinboro passes in the loss to the Fighting Scots on September 8, marking the third time in his collegiate career that he recorded a pair of picks in a single game. The two interceptions gave him 10 for his career. Jordan then returned an interception 18 yards for a touchdown against West Chester - the second pick-six of his career. Two weeks ago, Jordan intercepted his fourth pass of the year - tied for fourth-most in the PSAC. His partner at cornerback, senior Marquis Seamon, is third in the PSAC and ranks 15th in the country in passes defended per game (1.56). Seamon is tied with Jordan for the team lead in interceptions with four and leads the team with ten pass breakups through nine games this season.

WINNING REPUTATION

The Huskies closed out 2017 with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. The Huskies need to win two of their last three games to keep the streak alive.

JAHRI EVANS INDUCTED INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Former Husky great Jahri Evans '07 was inducted into the Bloomsburg University Athletic Hall of Fame on October 19 as part of the Hall of Fame Class of 2018. Evans took over as a full-time starter on the Huskies' offensive line in 2003 but it was in 2004 that the awards started rolling in for the left tackle. He was an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) First Team All-American as a junior while earning Second Team All-American honors from both the Associated Press and from the Don Hansen Football Gazette. Then, as a senior in 2005, Evans helped the Huskies to an average of 284.3 rushing yards per game - eighth-most in the country. He went on to earn First Team All-American honors from five different organizations - the AFCA, Daktronics, Don Hansen Football Gazette, Associated Press, and D2Football.com. He

was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, which honors the nation's top lineman in Division II, in each of his last two seasons. He earned both the Danny Litwhiler Award as Bloomsburg's Male Underclass Athlete of the Year in 2005 and the Robert B. Redman Award as Bloomsburg's Male Senior Athlete of the Year in 2006. Evans was then selected in the fourth round (108th overall) by the New Orleans Saints in the 2006 NFL Draft, becoming the first Huskies' player chosen in the draft since 1992. He was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named a First Team All-Pro in four consecutive seasons from 2009-12 while earning Second Team All-Pro accolades in 2013. Evans was also named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team in 2006, was a two-time Madden Most Valuable Protectors Award recipient (2009, 2011), and was a member of the New Orleans Saints' 50th Anniversary Team in 2016. Among Saints' offensive linemen, his six Pro Bowl appearances ranks second all-time in team history. He also ranks second all-time in Saints' history with 169 career games played. He helped the Saints finish in the top six in the league in total offense in all 11 of his seasons (2006-2016), including six number-one rankings. He also helped New Orleans finish in the top ten in scoring in nine of his 11 seasons, including number one rankings in 2008 and 2009. Evans was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned First Team All-Pro recognition for the first time in 2009 - a season that was capped off with the Saints' victory over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV. Other members of this year's class were Joe Bressi (women's basketball coach), Susan Brophy O'Donnell '81 (women's swimming), Adam Clay '05 (men's soccer), Megan LaBuda '02 (women's basketball), Jen Lefever '96 (softball), and Tom Vargo '66 (wrestling).

PRESEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fourth in the PSAC preseason coaches poll released in early August. The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record (4-3 in the East) - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. The Huskies finished fourth in the Eastern Division last year and have not finished worse than fourth in the division since 1992 when they went 2-8 overall and 1-5 in divisional play.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Bloomsburg led by 21 points (28-7) at the half in Saturday's victory over Millersville. The lead was pretty safe, as the Huskies' home record since 1923 when having a halftime advantage of 21 or more is now 44-1. Only once before have they had a halftime lead of 28-7 at home. That was in a 45-14 win versus Wayne State in 1996. This was the fifth largest all-time halftime lead at home over Millersville, all of them coming since 2003. The most was 32 points in 2009, when Bloomsburg was up 35-3 over the Marauders on the way to a 45-10 victory.

The Huskies have defeated Millersville 19 consecutive times, now the second longest winning streak against a single opponent in school history. The victory broke a tie with Kutztown, which Bloomsburg beat 18 straight from 1993 to 2010. The record is 28 versus Cheyney from 1990-2017, which is still active since the Wolves dropped their football program after last season. The two other longest streaks are both versus Mansfield: 15 from 1948 to 1962 and 14 from 1993 to 2006.

Bloomsburg held Millersville to (-8) yards rushing on Saturday. This is the second fewest yards surrendered in a game over the past 26 years since 1993. In 1996, the Huskies held Mansfield to (-16) yards on the ground in a 74-13 win, also at home. The two other negative rushing games were (-5) in that 45-14 home win over Wayne State in 1996 and (-3) in a 31-12 victory at Kutztown in 2013.

The Huskies concluded season's play in Redman Stadium with a record of 4-2. They have now gone 25 straight seasons since their last losing record at home in 1993. In 45 years at Redman covering 240 games, Bloomsburg's record is now 160-76-4. For the first 20 seasons, from 1974 to 1993, its record at home was 46-49-3, a winning percentage of .485. In the 25 seasons since then, the Huskies have a record of 114-27-1, winning nearly 81% of the time.

The 38-14 final on Saturday was the sixth time the Huskies have won a contest by that score in the 1,081 games played in school history. All have come since 2000 and it was the fourth time at home. The three previous home wins were over Indiana and Northwood in 2000 and Slippery Rock in 2002. The two road wins were at Millersville in 2012 and Gannon in 2013.

Bloomsburg's all-time record on November 3 in 15 games since 1894 is 10-5, with a record of 4-2 at home and 6-3 on the road. The most memorable game played on this date was in 1984 at West Chester, when a 50-yard touchdown pass on the final play of the game from quarterback Jay Dedeia to Curtis Still gave the Huskies a 34-31 victory and their first ever PSAC East title.

Saturday's game with West Liberty is Bloomsburg's first with that institution, but the fourth in school history versus a team from West Virginia. The previous three have all been on the road: a 33-0 win over Fairmont State in 2005, 24-21 over Shepherd in 2006, and a 32-26 loss to Concord in 2014, the last two in the NCAA playoffs.

The all-time record for the Huskies in 82 games versus out-of-state teams is 45-35-2, with a mark of 26-11-1 at home and 19-24-1 on the road.

A TRADITION OF RUSHING

The Huskies have posted a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last eight seasons, 13 of the last 15, and in 15 of the last 18 campaigns. In 2011 and 2012, Bloomsburg had two separate 1,000-yard rushers to become the first team in the PSAC to have back-to-back seasons with a pair of 1,000-yard backs. Here is a list of Bloomsburg's 1,000-yard rushers since Mike Morrucci's first BU 1,000-yard season in 1978:

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on December 6, 2013 after being appointed interim head coach in February, 2013. Overall, he will be starting his 22nd season with the Huskies in 2018 and sixth as head coach.

Darragh enters the 2018 campaign with a 41-17 overall record (.707). The 41 victories over his first five seasons marks the most wins in the first five years of a coaching career at Bloomsburg while his .707 winning percentage is the third-best mark during the first five years of a coaching tenure (Robert Redman went 38-4 (.905) from 1947-51 and Danny Hale went 40-14-1 (.736) from 1993-97). With Darragh on the Huskies' staff, dating back to his first season as defensive coordinator in 1997, Bloomsburg has compiled an overall record of 182-61 (.749).

The Huskies closed out the 2017 season with a 7-4 record - Bloomsburg's 19th consecutive winning season dating back to 1999. It is the third-longest streak in PSAC history, behind West Chester's 31 (1940-42, 1945-72) and Clarion's 22 (1964-85). The 19 straight seasons with at least six victories, however, continues a PSAC record. Bloomsburg has now posted a winning record in 23 of the last 24 years. Nine Huskies were named All-PSAC East including defensive tackle Jake Klinger, who was an All-Region selection by two different organizations and also a Don Hansen first team All-American.

In 2016, the Huskies saw their streak of 17 consecutive seasons of at least seven victories come to an end but, Bloomsburg did extend its consecutive winning season streak to 18 straight as the team went 6-5 overall and finished in a tie for third place in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division with a 4-3 mark.

Six players earned All-PSAC East First or Second Team nods with redshirt sophomore defensive lineman, Chris Gary, also earning Second Team All-American accolades from Don Hansen. Gary finished the season with a PSAC-leading 12.5 sacks - one shy of tying the school record of 13.5 set by Larry Webster in 2012. Bloomsburg's defense, in particular, was good last season as it finished second in the conference in passing yards allowed per game (193.2) and was fifth in points allowed per contest (23.7).

The 2015 edition saw the Huskies finish fourth in the PSAC in rushing offense (228.7), aided by Lawrence Elliott, Jr., who finished as the league's leading rusher in yards per game (131.5). Bloomsburg also finished second in the conference in scoring defense (19.7) and second in total defense (320.8). At year's end, Bloomsburg had nine players named to the All-PSAC East First or Second Teams with Elliott, Jr. also capturing All-Region Second Team honors from the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association (D2CCA).

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths, and a PSAC Championship (2013) while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies' head coach to reach 20 victories. Following the 2014 season, he was honored as the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Super Region One Coach of the Year.

The 2014 squad won its first ten games on the way to an 11-2 record, clinching the PSAC East crown and the second seed in the Super Region One playoff bracket. Bloomsburg reached the regional championship game, after a second round playoff win over Virginia State, to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43, and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season, Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship, and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster, who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, and offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans. Feiler is now a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers organization.

Prior to taking over the reins as the head coach, Darragh served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach, Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership, the Huskies' defense ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense in seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second-place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second-place ranking in 2009. The Huskies also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense, finishing first or second five times.

The 2009 Huskies led the PSAC, and finished third nationally, in scoring defense (13.36/game). Bloomsburg also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010, the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Under Darragh's leadership as the defensive coordinator, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times from 2000 to 2012.

While serving as the defensive coordinator, Darragh also coached 57 First Team All-PSAC performers, ten All-Americans, and three PSAC East Defensive Players of the Year in Justin Shirk (2014), Anthony Smith (2009) and Mike Varanavage (2010).

Prior to Bloomsburg, Darragh worked for two years at Indiana (PA) as the linebackers coach. He started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Temple from 1987-89. From there, Darragh coached the linebackers at Northeastern and Gannon before being promoted to defensive coordinator at Gannon.

He moved from Gannon to the defensive coordinator post at William Paterson College before joining the Indiana (PA) staff. A three-year starter and captain for Temple, he graduated in 1985 after earning All-East honors as an inside linebacker.

Darragh and his wife, Yelena, live in Bloomsburg and are the parents of three children Sasha, 30, Lemuel, 27, and Gabriel, 17.
